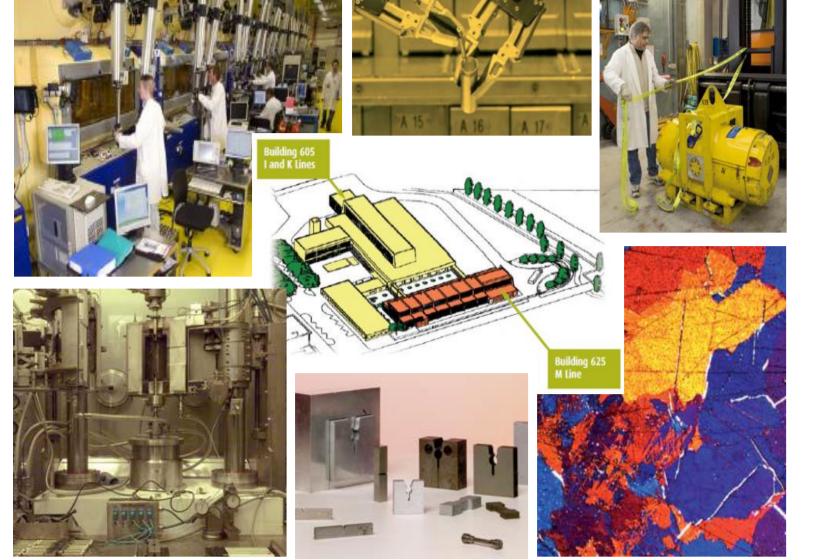

An experimental platform for the analysis of neutron irradiated materials at the nanometric scale in LECI hotlab facility

LECI hotlab facility located in CEA/Paris-Saclay



Hot laboratory mostly dedicated to mechanical and metallurgical characterization of neutron irradiated materials

Creation of a nanoscale characterization platform composed of :

*Within the Equipement d'Excellence GENESIS and associated with laboratories (GPM Rouen and CIMAP)

> Materials : steels, zirconium alloys, aluminum alloys, oxides, ODS, ceramics, graphites

Sample preparation equipments (nuclearization ongoing)

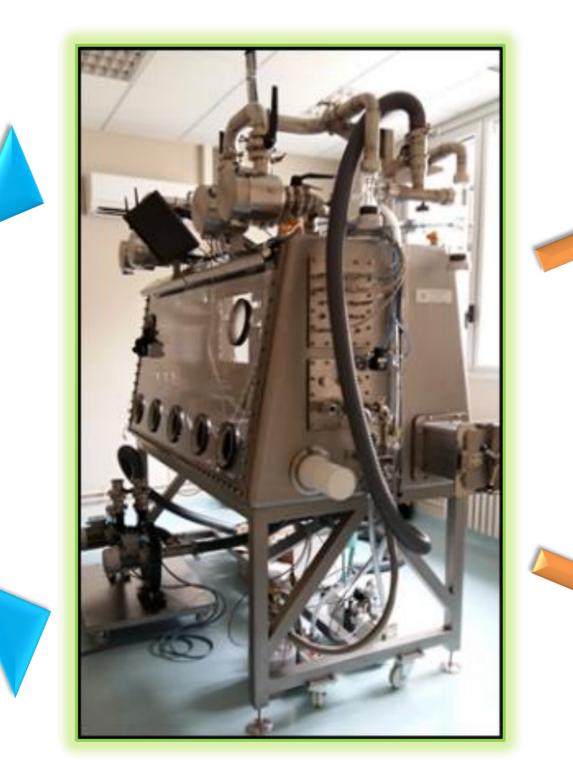
SEM-FIB



- \rightarrow Model ZEISS AURIGA 40 \rightarrow Dedicated to the preparation of TAP and **TEM** samples
- \rightarrow Nuclear activity : 45 GBq [Hotlab 2015 and 2017]

TAP MEB-FIB sample dimension : 2 μm x 2 μm x 10 μm

GLOVE BOX : preparation, storage and transfer of neutron irradiated samples



Sample nano-characterization equipments

NUCLEARIZED TEM

- \rightarrow Model FEI tecnai G² 30
- \rightarrow Selection of region of interest in the aim of TAP analysis
- \rightarrow Nuclearized since 2009
- \rightarrow Max admissible dose rate : 2 mGy/h
- \rightarrow Max nuclear activity : 20 MBq equ. ⁶⁰Co

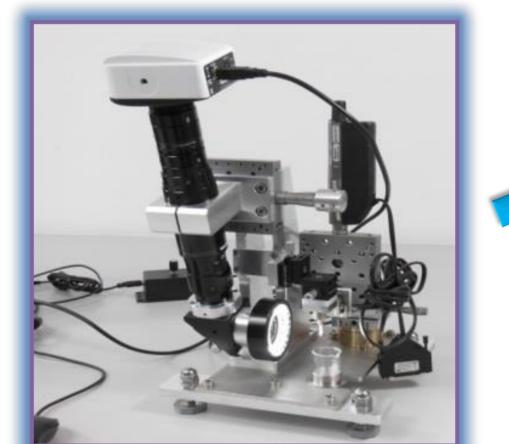


NUCLEARIZED TAP



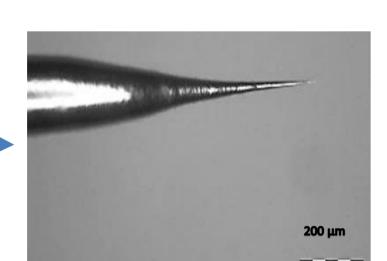
ELECTROPOLISHING MACHINE

- \rightarrow Model CEA
- \rightarrow Dedicated to the preparation of TAP electropolished samples in a shiedeld glove box
- \rightarrow Nuclear activity : 60 MBq





Shielded glove box for the electropolishing machine



Electropolished TAP sample dimension : 0,3 mm x 0,3 mm x 15 mm

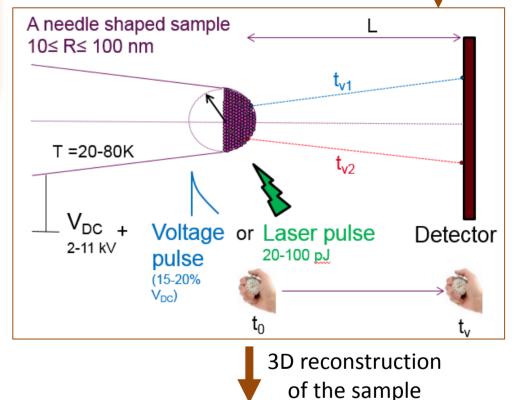
- Neutron irradiated sample storage
- Fine sample handling (optical microscope)
- **Radiological protection measurements**
- Sample cleaning (plasma cleaner)
- Leica vacuum system for the sample transfer between preparation equipment and TAP

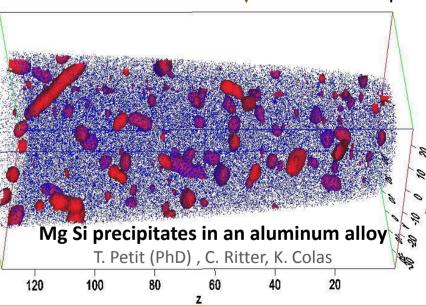




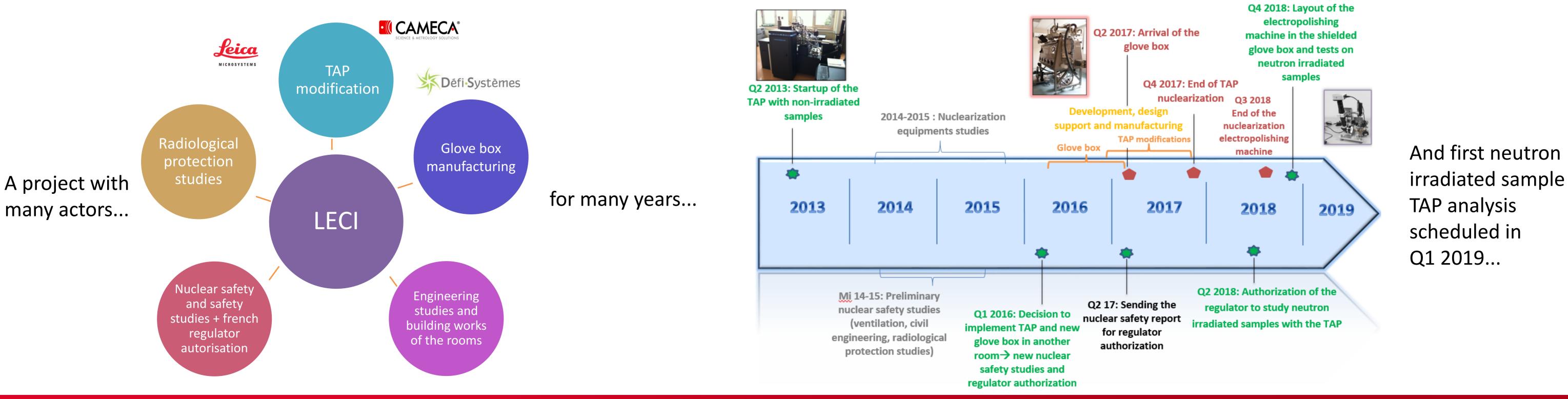
- \rightarrow TAP nuclearization : shielding of the detector, remote handling of vertical rod, vacuum transfer sample located on the TAP, cameras on the view ports
- \rightarrow Max admissible dose rate : 1,5 mGy/h at **5 cm**
- \rightarrow Max nuclear activity : no limit for MEB/FIB samples, 20 MBq equ. ⁶⁰Co for electropolished samples

- \rightarrow Model CAMECA LEAP 4000X HR \rightarrow High resolution three dimensional
- microscope
- \rightarrow Dedicated to the characterization of defects at the atomic scale as clusters, segregation,...
- \rightarrow Field effect evaporation method of the atoms on the surface of the sample \rightarrow nature and position of each atom of the sample
