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### INDUSTRIAL CONTEXT

#### Major steps of the spent nuclear fuel reprocessing



- Prior steps : dissolving and concentrating elements
- Uses high-concentrated and boiling HNO<sub>3</sub> to extract recoverable uranium and plutonium from other fission products.
- But if HNO<sub>3</sub> helps to dissolve fuel, structures are not completely saved...

### MATERIALS USED IN NITRIC MEDIA

Materials selected undergo <u>uniform corrosion</u> in the specific conditions of service. If conditions change (introdution of oxidizing species), corrosion is no more uniform.

For a first approach focus on 304L SS behaviour304LSS probes are easier to supply than other materials

### **Current practice**

- Corrosion is taken into account by the dimensioning, based on predicting models validated by experimental results.
- Media chemistry is well-known, it is regularly controlled by periodical inspections using non-destructive testings

### Outlook

For more robustness : collecting real-time data with in-situ ongoing monitoring



#### *Ceaden* THE ELECTRICAL RESISTANCE PROBE METHOD



Measurment principle: 2 identical resistances (measure and reference) inserted in an electrical circuit. Reference voltage compared to measure voltage. mes element



$$\frac{V_{ref}}{V_{mes}} = \frac{R_{ref}}{R_{mes}} = \frac{th_{mes}}{th_{ref}} = \frac{th_t}{th_{t_0}}$$



ref element

- Method is sensitive to section variation
- Customised sensitivity and time of response (depending on corrosion rates expected)
- Independent of media chemistry (unlike other electrochemical methods)
- Resistance value depends only on remaining metal thickness

Corrosion rate measurment deduced from change of resistance over a period of time. Only reliable in case of uniform dissolution without conductive deposits

## Ceaden Probe and Material

- Model 2510 (cylindrical) manufactured by Cosasco<sup>®</sup>
- 2 tubes identical to test element are supplied for making corrosion coupons





#### Tile-shaped corrosion coupons

#### Microstructure :

Element С Si Ni Mn P S Cr Fe Content (%w) 0.025 0.31 1.89 0.027 0.002 18.1 9.05 bal.

Chemical analysis of 304L SS (certificate of conformance)

- mean grain size : 35 μm
- same microstructure in both directions of the tube





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### Ceaden Experimental Setup

Procedure : comparison of probe's response to gravimetric method
Test solution : boiling (104 °C) HNO<sub>3</sub> 3 mol/L with 0,8 g/L Vanadium (valency +V)



Corrosion coupons hung up on a circular sample holder



**Gravimetric method** (reference method)

$$\Delta e = \frac{\Delta_m}{S_{sample} \times \rho}$$

 $\begin{array}{ll} \rho = \ volumic \ weight \\ \Delta m = weight \ loss \\ S = \ initial \ surface \ of \ the \ sample \end{array}$ 

## Ceaden Experimental Setup

4 corrosion coupons hung up on a circular sample holder

## Ceaden Experimental Setup

- Procedure : comparison of probe's response in InterGranular Corrosion mode to gravimetric method
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4 corrosion coupons hung up on a circular sample holder



Corrosion coupon

Coupons are withdrawned after 308 h, 633 h, 982 h and 1532 h of exposure time.
Probe acquiring frequency is 2 h.
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### Ceaden PROBE RESULTS

#### Evolution of thickness loss read by ER probe



- Test is stopped before span is reached (125 μm)
- Solution is not renewed during the whole test

- Non-linear evolution with time
- Global thickness loss afetr 124 days = 102 μm, Global appearent corrosion rate : 300 μm/year

### ER PROBE RESULTS COMPARED TO CORROSION COUPONS

## Evolution of thickness loss determined by ER probe and by coupons mass loss vs time



- Values for coupons are repeatable
- They differ from probe's values
- The gap increase with time
- Probe seems to minimize thickness loss
- After 63 days thickness losses (µm) :

Probe	Coupons	
38	64	

 After 63 days appearent global r<sub>corr</sub> (µm/year):

Probe	Coupons	
220	360	

Global appearent  $r_{corr}$  increase with time in both cases  $\rightarrow$  corrosion is not uniform. These rates are comparative parameters but what is their meaning?

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### **COUPONS SURFACE EXAMINATION**



## Ceaden PROBE CROSS SECTION EXAMINATION



Mean values of residual (probe element) and reference thickness (µm)

Tops	Bottoms	Mean value	Reference tube
163 ± 18	114 ± 16	136 ± 29	240 ± 8

Deduced dissolved thickness : th<sub>cor=</sub> 104 µm consistent with probe value (102 µm)
ER probe returns « mean » results consistent with observations, even if this « mean » corroded thickness is not relevant because it doesn't reflect the thinest value.

## 22 den Mechanism For Igc Mode

**Statement** : evolution of thickness loss follows a trend, and also its derivative:



**SCIANS** : « laboratory-made » tool developped to simulate IGC in steels based on the shape of the mass loss kinetics. (*B. Gwinner and AI / Corrosion Science 107 (2016)/60-75*)

## Ceaden scians : A MODEL TO SIMULATE IGC

#### **SCIANS Assumptions :**

- ✤ V<sub>S</sub> and V<sub>GB</sub><sup>\*</sup> are identical and constant in time all over the surface
- Grains geometry is simplified (square grains)



$$V_{GB} *= \frac{V_S}{2} + \sqrt{\left(\frac{V_S}{2}\right)^2 + \frac{3}{2} \times slope \times D}$$

V<sub>S</sub> is the y intercept , D is a material data (measured) and slope is deduced from experimental date.

- The initial value corresponds to V<sub>s</sub> (initial dissolution of metal)
- Stationary value corresponds to 1st grains raw's dropping and is equal to V<sub>GB</sub>\*.
  - The transition time is linked to grain size D and  $V_{GB}^*$  and a geometrical factor  $f_G$ .



Schematic illustration for the determination of the transition time

Extrapolation of coupons thickness loss using SCIANS compared to probe response



Same  $V_s = 180 \mu m/year$ 

Same V<sub>GB</sub><sup>\*</sup> = 430 µm/year

Transition times are different (twice as the coupons for the probe): due to a different geometrical factor  $t = f_G \frac{D}{V_{GB}^*}$ 

## <u>Ceaden</u> conclusion

- In this very corrosive media, ER probe resisted and gave a response during 3 months
- Thickness loss measured by ER probe is lower than that measured by gravimetric method at the same time
- Corroded thickness measured by the probe is relevant with mean remaining thickness observed on polished cross-section
- Appearant corrosion rate has no sense ; V<sub>GB</sub><sup>\*</sup> is the most important parameter
- Using IGC simulating model SCIANS, it becomes possible to infer V<sub>GB</sub><sup>\*</sup>.
  - > Outlook in-service applications.

- Currently, no reliable explanation of the offset between gravimetric and ER probe....but it is under investigation
  - $\rightarrow$  size effect (surface probe is 5 times more important)?
  - $\rightarrow$  effect of geometry (edges or tips)?
  - $\rightarrow$  current effect?
