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# **New He Equation of State for Pressurized** Nanobubbles in UO<sub>2</sub>: **Molecular Dynamics Simulations**



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# Motivation

During storage helium atoms accumulate in spent T. Wiss et al. JNM 451 (2014) 198

fuel via  $\alpha$ -decay. These helium atoms may cluster into nanoscopic bubbles (c.f. opposite Figure), which could change the physical properties of spent fuel. To estimate the impact of such bubbles, it is essential to possess a good thermodynamical model for helium interacting with the surrounding matrix including states at high pressures and temperatures. Therefore, MD simulations are carried out to establish a new equation of state (EOS) for helium in nanobubbles embedded in UO<sub>2</sub> matrix.

# He EOS embedded in UO<sub>2</sub>

The hard-sphere formalism based on Carnahan-Starling model is used to fit the new EOS. However, we account herein for the interactions between the UO<sub>2</sub> matrix and the He atoms. The new parameters for the He EOS are:

$$P_{He} = \frac{k_B T}{V_{at}} \frac{(1+y+y^2-y^3)}{(1-y)^3}$$

Packing factor 
$$y = \frac{1}{V_{at}} \frac{\pi d^3}{6}$$

Hard-sphere diameter

$$d = \sigma \left[ A - B \ln \left( \frac{T}{\varepsilon} \right) \right]$$

50 ps

- Bubbles sizes: 1 to 10 nm
- Temperatures: 300 to 900 K
- Helium concentration: 3×10<sup>-2</sup> to 0.4 mol.cm<sup>-3</sup>  $(0.3 \rightarrow 3.3 \text{ n}_{\text{He}}/\text{n}_{\text{vac}})$

# He spatial distribution in bubble

We observe an inhomogeneity in the He atom distribution inside the nanobubble. A **boundary** layer of ~1 nm thickness appears at the bubble surface where He atoms are more concentrated.





## d in [Å] $d = 2.973 \ 0.8414 - 0.05 \ln\left(\frac{1}{10.985}\right)$ *T* in [K]

 $V_{at}$  max = 7.8×10<sup>-30</sup> m<sup>3</sup>

⇒ Allows more He atoms in bubbles than with previous Eos (I Brearley & D MacInnes JNM 95 (1980) 239)

# Mechanics of nanobubbles

## Damage:

- For diameter < 5 nm => No damage found
- For diameter ≥ 5 nm both nano-cracks and dislocations appear at the bubble surface for He concentration  $\geq 2.4 \text{ n}_{\text{He}}/\text{n}_{\text{vac}}$  (5 nm) and  $\geq$  1.9 n<sub>He</sub>/n<sub>vac</sub> (10 nm)

## <u>Critical pressures</u>:

- 5 nm: P<sub>He</sub><sup>crit</sup> = 10.4 GPa
- 10 nm: P<sub>He</sub><sup>crit</sup> = 6.5 GPa

Equivalent to Griffith criterion for brittle fracture:







# Conclusions

A series of MD simulations have been carried out to determine the He equation of state inside nanobubble embedded into UO<sub>2</sub> matrix. To facilitate its implementation into fuel performance codes, we use the same hardsphere formalism than in the Brearley-MacInnes model. We observe an inhomogeneity in the He atom distribution inside the nanobubble with a boundary layer of about 1 nm thick appearing at the bubble surface where He atoms are more concentrated. We found also a concentration limit for the He atoms inside the nanobubble, which equals 1.6  $n_{He}/n_{vac}$ . For bubble diameters higher than 5 nm nano-cracks or dislocations appear at the bubble surface. At this length-scale, the critical pressure for the crack onset is equivalent to the values calculated with the Griffith criterion for brittle fracture.

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
