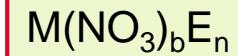
# New investigations on the selectivity

Objective: Better knowledge about the influence of the ramification of alkyl chains



## 1/ Speciation and structural information

- Geometry around the cation
  - Crystals (XRD)
  - In solution (EXAFS)
- Stoichiometry of complexes (ESI-MS, slope analysis)



## 2/ Thermodynamic properties related to the extraction

Describe **the distribution** of a solute as a single net equilibrium and application of classical mass balance

# Structure of U(VI)-amides complexes (crystals X-ray diffraction)



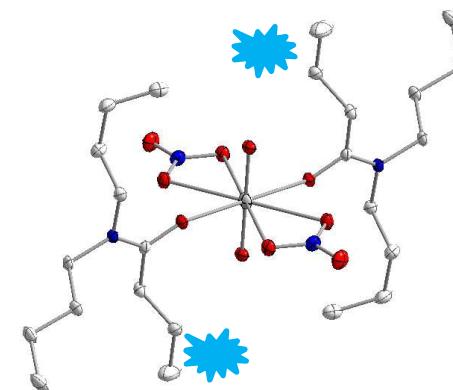
## ➤ Identical coordination sphere for all complexes

- Stoichiometry 1:2 (2 monoamides and 2 bidentate nitrates)
- CN = 6
- Hexagonal bi-pyramide

## ➤ Similar distances

## ➤ Influence of ramified alkyl chains

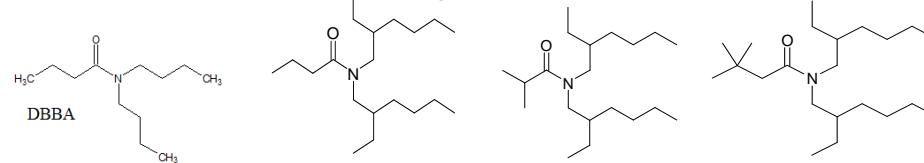
DBiBA: isopropyl group turns towards the cation –       $\Rightarrow$  Less favorable configuration  
significant steric constrains and distortion (torsion angle)

- Model from solid compounds suitable with organic samples: 2 amides and 2 bidentate and symmetrical nitrate
- No modification with ramification of alkyl chain



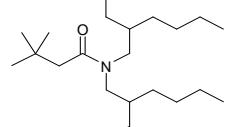

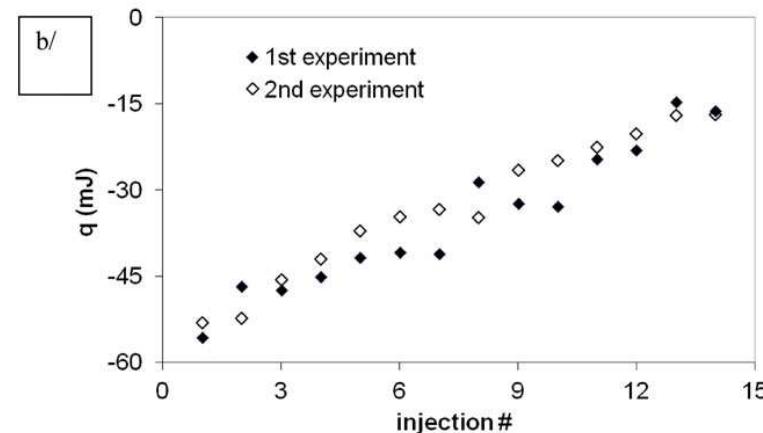
## ➤ Calorimetry

1 M Amide  
Dodecane  
 $C_{\text{U}}^{\text{init}} 0.2 \text{ M}$   
aqueous medium  
3M HNO<sub>3</sub>  
And {1M HNO<sub>3</sub> + 2M LiNO<sub>3</sub>}



DEHiBA.  
initial aqueous phase:  
500  $\mu\text{L} C_{\text{UO}_2(\text{NO}_3)_2} = 0.07 \text{ mol L}^{-1}$  and  $C_{\text{LiNO}_3} = 3 \text{ mol L}^{-1}$   
initial organic phase:  
300  $\mu\text{L} C_{\text{DEHiBA}} = 1 \text{ mol L}^{-1}$  in *n*-dodecane

25.000 °C – stirring 120 tr min<sup>-1</sup> –  
15  $\times$  15  $\mu\text{L}$  organic phase with a speed of 0.5  $\mu\text{L s}^{-1}$



$$\Delta_{\text{ext}}H = -27.9 \pm 0.3 \text{ kJ/mol}$$

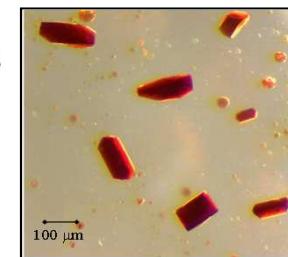
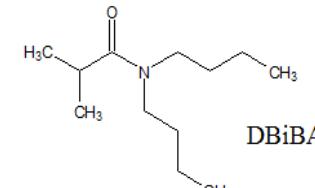
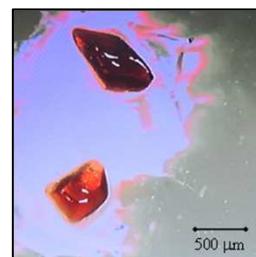
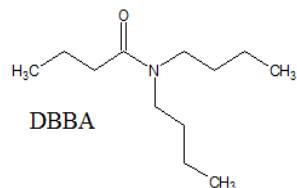


**Similar complexes 1:2 with the 3 amides**

**Similar thermodynamic properties with the 3 amides: compensation between  $\Delta H$  and  $T\Delta S$**

**No influence of the steric hindrance of the radical**

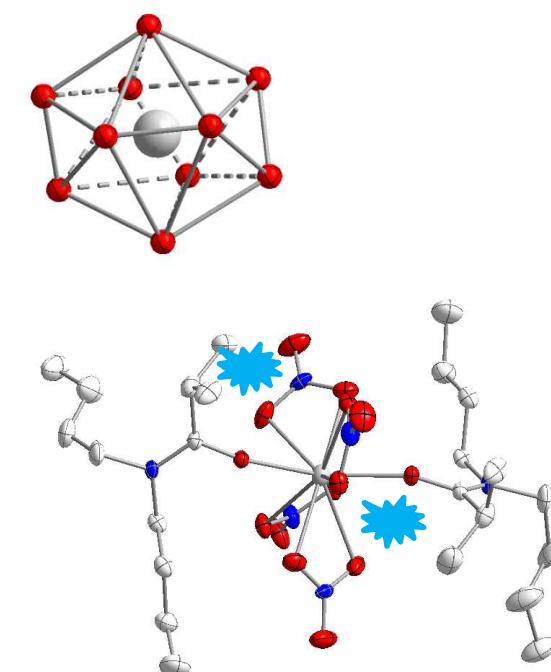
# Structure of M(IV)-amides complexes (crystals X-ray diffraction)



Identical coordination sphere for all complexes

- Stoichiometry 1:2 (2 monoamides and 4 bidentate nitrates)
- CN = 10
- Distorted bi-capped dodecahedron

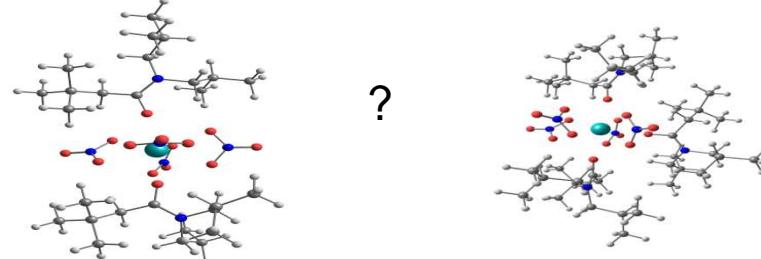

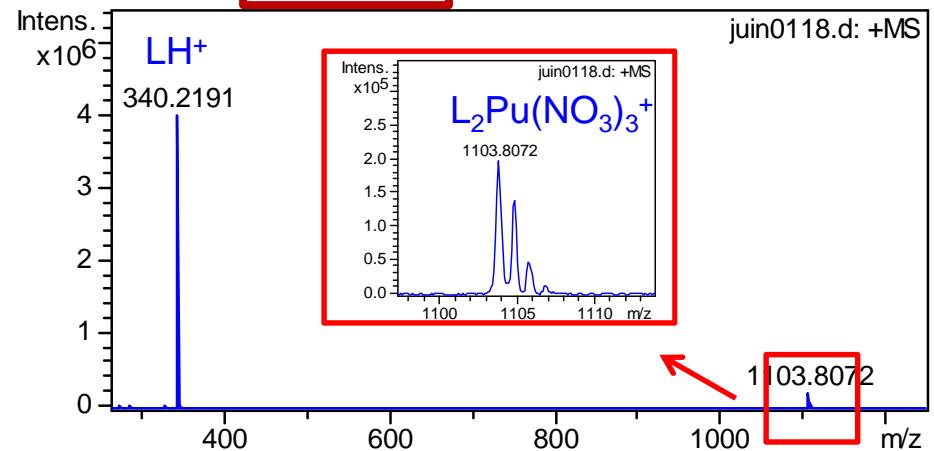

3M by amide 0.5M-dodecane)

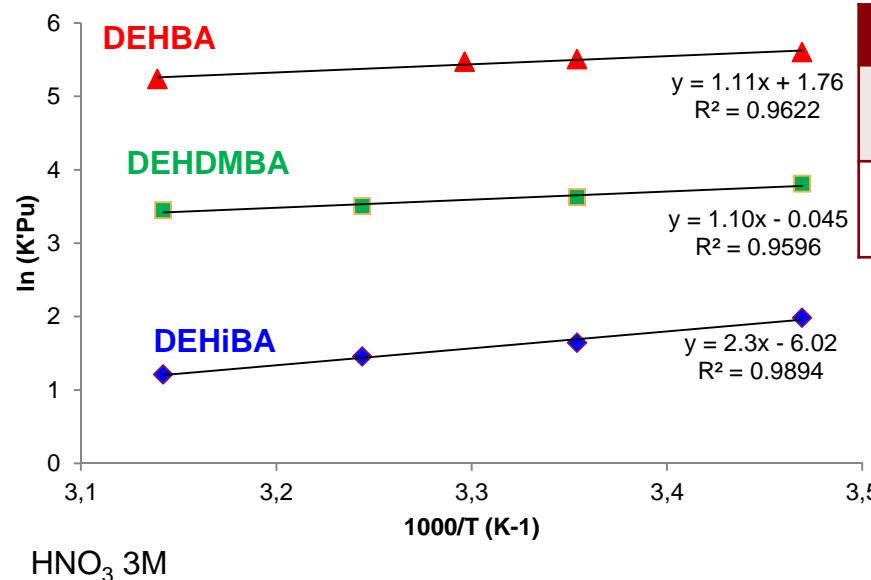
Best fit: Pu(NO<sub>3</sub>)<sub>4</sub>L<sub>2</sub>

Best fit: mixture of Pu(NO<sub>3</sub>)<sub>4</sub>L<sub>2</sub> and Pu(NO<sub>3</sub>)<sub>4</sub>(HNO<sub>3</sub>)<sub>2</sub>,L<sub>2</sub>

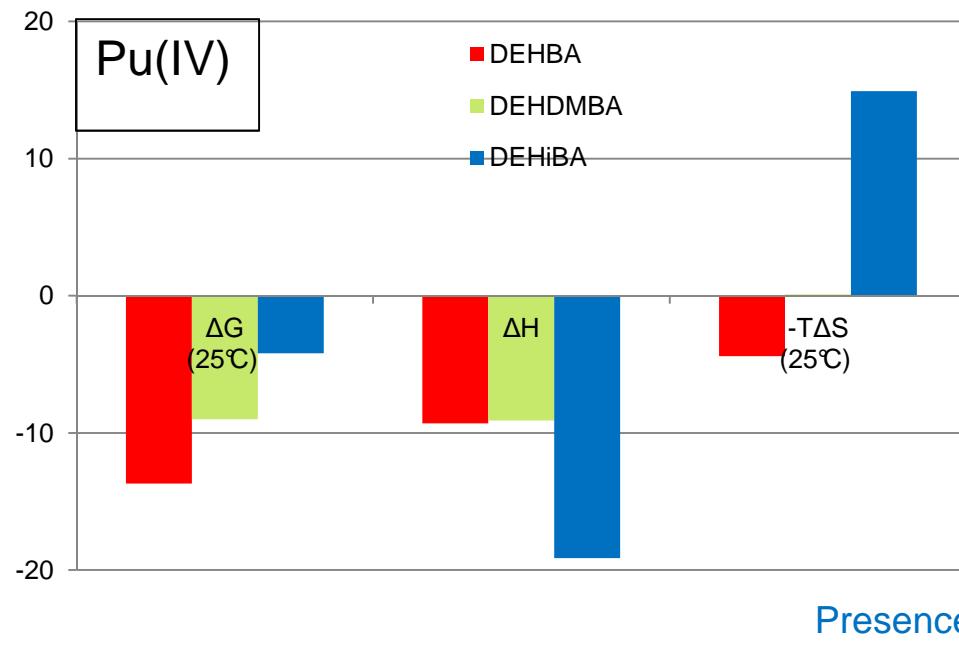
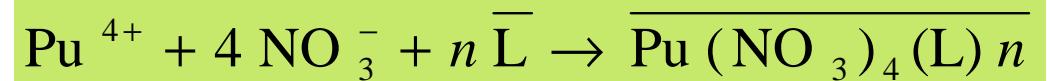

# Extraction Pu(IV) - Thermodynamic properties (2)



$\Delta H$  increases with steric hindrance

Entropic term favorable when  
steric hindrance decreases

## Detailed analysis to identify the driving force

$$1/ \Delta (\Delta_{\text{ext}} G^\circ)_{\text{L2/L1}} = \cancel{\Delta (\Delta_{\text{dehydration}} G^\circ)_{\text{L2/L1}}} + \Delta (\Delta_{\text{coordination}} G^\circ)_{\text{L2/L1}} + \Delta (\Delta_{\text{solvation}} G^\circ)_{\text{L2/L1}}$$

$$2/ \Delta (\Delta_{\text{ext}} G^\circ)_{\text{Pu/U}} = \Delta (\Delta_{\text{ext}} H^\circ)_{\text{Pu/U}} - T \Delta (\Delta_{\text{ext}} S^\circ)_{\text{Pu/U}}$$

Further analysis:

- check the nature of complexes with other amides and in less acidic conditions, if necessary, addition of equilibria (with related thermodynamic properties)

# Conclusion

## Selectivity U(VI)/Pu(IV) by dialkylamide extractants

- extraction of U(VI): no (small) influence of ramified alkyl chain on structure and on thermodynamic properties
- extraction of Pu(IV): influence of ramified alkyl chain on C=O
  - no influence in solid phase (first amide-Pu crystal!)
  - amides are partially present in the outer sphere
  - thermodynamic properties (enthalpy and entropy) modified

The selectivity U(VI)/Pu(IV) comes from the behaviour of Pu(IV): further studies will focus on this cation

*Interest of multi techniques approach for such complex systems.*

*Importance of speciation insight to complete the thermodynamic approach*
