Abstract_Body As a caracteristic fission product with a half-life of 28.8 years, Sr-90 must be quantified in nuclear waste. Prior to its nuclear measurement, it is necessary to separate it from its matrix and interferents with radiochemical method. The extraction chromatographic resin, Sr-resin[®], developed by Eichrom in the 1990's is widely applied. Its efficiency has been demonstrated for a wide range of samples even if pre-treatments are necessary depending on the nature of the sample. For nuclear waste, difficulties can be encountered especially with samples with high Pu content. A precipitation with ammonia can be used but this can lead to a Sr loss depending on the experimental conditions (ex: digestion step with HF acid or not) and interferents present. In this presentation, the robustness of an alternative pre-treatment using TRU-resin® will be highlighted.
