RELIABILITY IN PV

85% of the world's installed solar PV capacity has operated for less than five years

Design for reliability in PV

RELIABILITY IN PV: THE NORM IEC61215

Unqualified modules suffered from **45%** filed failure rate, while **qualified** modules suffered from less than **0.1%** filed failure rate. *(Wohlgemuth, 2012)*

Environmental stress test

- Thermal cycling
- Humidity freeze
- Damp heat
- UV preconditioning

RELIABILITY IS ALSO SUSTAINABILITY

Ecodesign approach for circular economy strategy

Strategies for circularity are encompassed with the "R-ladder" strategy (refuse, rethink, reduce, reuse, repair, remanufacture, repurpose, recycle, energy recovery).

As a circular economy covers the entire lifecycle of a product, it requires a broad and systemic approach to production.

CHALLENGES ON NEW MATERIALS AND MODULE DESIGN

E New technological requirements

- *Wafertechnology*
- *New cell and interconnection technologies*
- *New module designs*
- *Less material use (In, Ag)*

New cell technologies

- PERC and HJT will become dominant cell technologies
- Half cells will gain more market share
- Module sizes increase

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Or Ag-free moving to Cupper!

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CHALLENGES ON NEW MATERIALS AND MODULE DESIGN

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 $\mathbf{W}\mathbf{p}$ (kWp)

- 1. Safe road of continued optimisation
- 2. Introduction of novel materials and technologies
- 1. Tandems

Reduction of environmental impact by biosourced/designed for recycled module packaging materials

CHALLENGES ON NEW MATERIALS AND MODULE DESIGN

- **External and internal stress factors influence performance and long-term reliability of PV modules**
- The materials in PV modules have to withstand extremely challenging micro-climatic conditions.

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CHALLENGES FOR NEW MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

Check of compatibility of PV module components will get more and more important in the future, as the variety on materials and components will grow

Adhesion - delamination:

- *Adhesion to glass and solar cell strongly dependent of lamination parameters*
- *Surface treatment of backsheets usually optimized for adhesion to EVA but not alternative encapsulants*

Backsheet yellowing: *Migration of additives into backsheet -encapsulant interface are main cause for backsheet yellowing*

Corrosion: *Broad variety of new ribbon materials, interconnection technologies and encapsulant films*

NEED OF TESTING NEW MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

Different levels with increasing effort in sample preparation and test procedures

All levels of testing needed in order to guarantee high quality and reliability

> **High number of tested specimen**

TESTING AND QUALIFICATION OF NEW MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

Material qualification protocol – backsheet and encapsulants

Optical testing for UV stability Aim: Assess the variation of the product after 15 kWh/m² UV light exposure

Water absorption

Aim: Record mass variation du to water uptake

Tensile stress - strain

Aim: Asses the material behaviour after 200h DH exposure

Peel strength

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Aim: Asses the material behaviour after 200h DH exposure in peeling configuration (180°)

Shrinkage in lamination conditions

Aim: Asses the material behaviour after 10 minutes of 160°C temperature exposure

TESTING AND QUALIFICATION OF NEW MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

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- Qualification of encapsulant/backsheet pairs in mini-module
- Best performing backsheets: Al-based (D, I) and PP (A)
- **Two key properties to ensure stability in DH : WVTR & peel strength**

SHJ modules (144 ½ cell) for selection of final encapsulant/ white and transparent backsheet pairs

TESTING ON DEDICATED DESERT CONDITIONS: ATACAMA DESERT

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Novel combined/sequentiel ageing tests simulating desert conditions: desert label

Need for adapted (to application and climat) accelerated testing supporting module innovations

- Variety and number of innovations in interconnections and materials are on the rise
- Increasing warranty durations by manufacturer
- Current practices impose technology and material qualification by 2-3x IEC61215 testing
- BUT too long and little relevant to detect failure modes
- Introduction of sequential, combined stress testing

TESTING ON DEDICATED DESERT CONDITIONS: ATACAMA DESERT

Accelerated ageing sequential ageing

- Acceleration of temprature carefully selected
	- Based on Arrhenius relation
	- Below Polymer fusion/elastic behaviour limit
	- Adapted commercial testing chambers
- **Validation with a selection of industrial benchmark modules**
	- \checkmark Same failure modes are triggered at higher T

 \checkmark Significant acceleration

FIRST CONCLUSION

- **Motivation for new materials and module designs**
	- *Decrease of LCOE: Cost reduction and performance improvement*
	- *New technological requirements*
	- *Sustainability and legal regulations. Lower LCA, Carbon footprint, local production PV systems designed for specific application and environmental conditions*
- **Challenges**
	- *Long term stability is determined by bill of materials and their material interactions*
	- *Each material combination should be tested thoroughly before introduction into the market*
	- *Single stress testing often does not reveal certain degradation modes observed in the field Combined or sequential stress testing necessary, new standards*

Better understanding of PV module and material degradation processes is a precondition for a successful development of new components and RELIABLE and SUSTAINABLE PV module designs

Does PK tandem need extra encapsulation for strong encapsulation against **H2O** and O_2 to prevent or to slow several degradation mechanisms ?

CHALLENGES FOR TANDEM:

STABILITY ISSUES & ENCAPSULATION STRATEGIES

- 1. Is standard c-Si technology **Hot Vacuum lamination enough?**
- Relatively slow process
- Low cost materials available but with poor gas barrier properties
- Use of additional edge sealing
- Limit of processing T°

2. Should we add **UV liquid adhesives (like OPV)?**

- Rapid process
- Low T° process
- Cost of gas barrier grade considering the thickness

3. Or go to extra **Thin film deposition layer?**

- No side permeation
- Need further encapsulation but can relax the constraints
- Need effective & pretty slow deposition process (ALD, PECVD)

CHALLENGES FOR TANDEM INTERCONNECTION

CHALLENGES FOR TANDEM INTERCONNECTION

Temperature < 160°C

- Bi or In alloy (120°C < Tf < 140°C)
- Compatibility with tandem metallization unknown
- $T_{process}$ critical (usually an overshoot +20°C above Tf is necessary)

Low temperature soldering

- Current process around 180°C **BUT** ECA curable at 120°C already assessed
- Silver consumption in ECA but less BB required for tandem (lower Jsc)

ECA ribbons

• ECA compatible as for BB

- Silver metallization less critical because of lower Jsc
- Laser cutting ?

Shingle

CONCLUSION

- Lessons learned, methodologies and protocols from cSi technology (and others) are the baseline for new PV technologies development.
- BOM has to be adapted for tandem and perovskite development taking into account al boundary conditions for > 30 y reliability with a sustainable approach.
- The Terawatt PV era is a multi-technology ERA. We need all technologies in the market to be able to a integrate PV everywhere with a sustainable manufacturing.
