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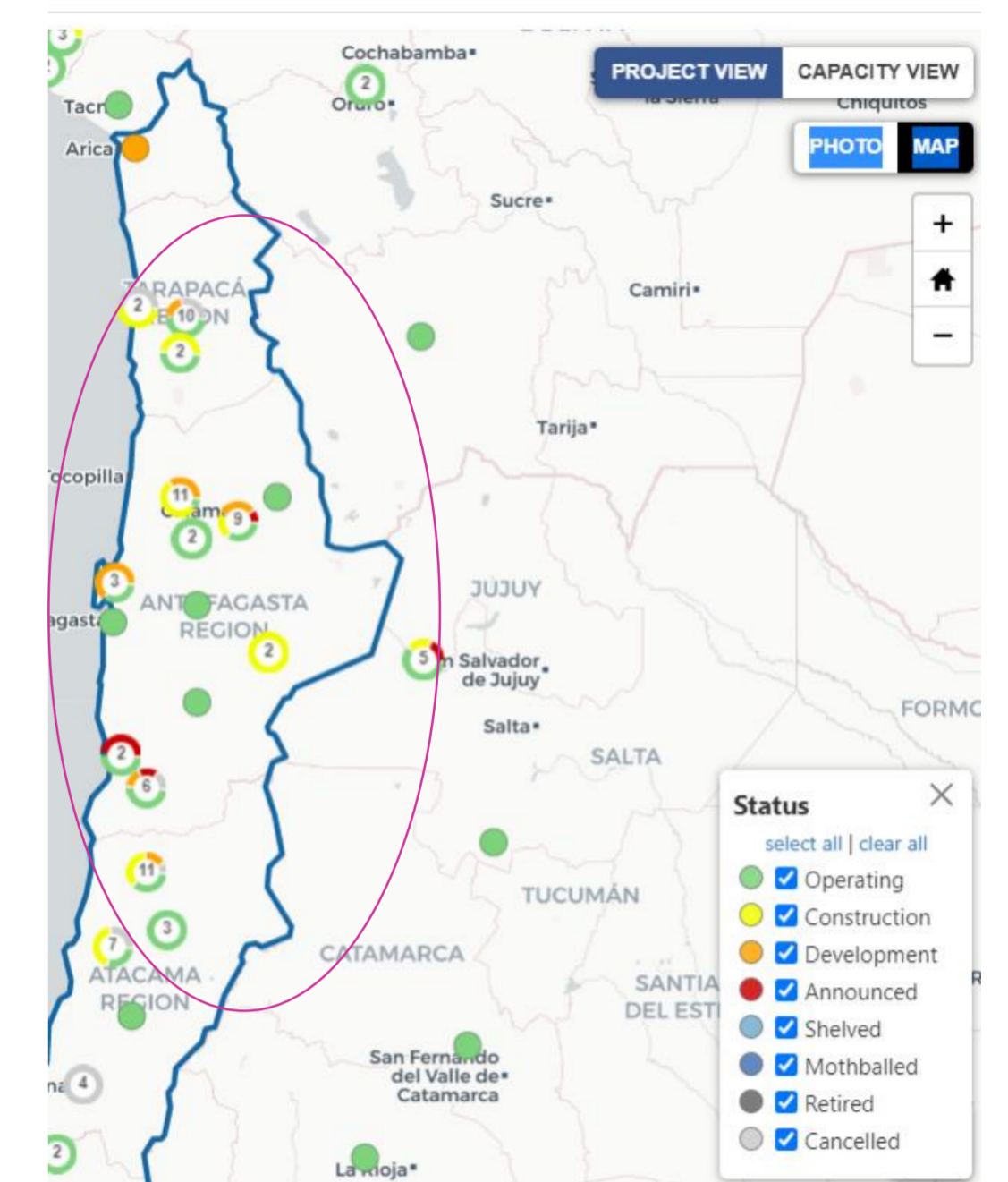
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Energy Transition, Solar PV and Circular Economy: triple helix approach to a Second Life for PV Modules in Chile

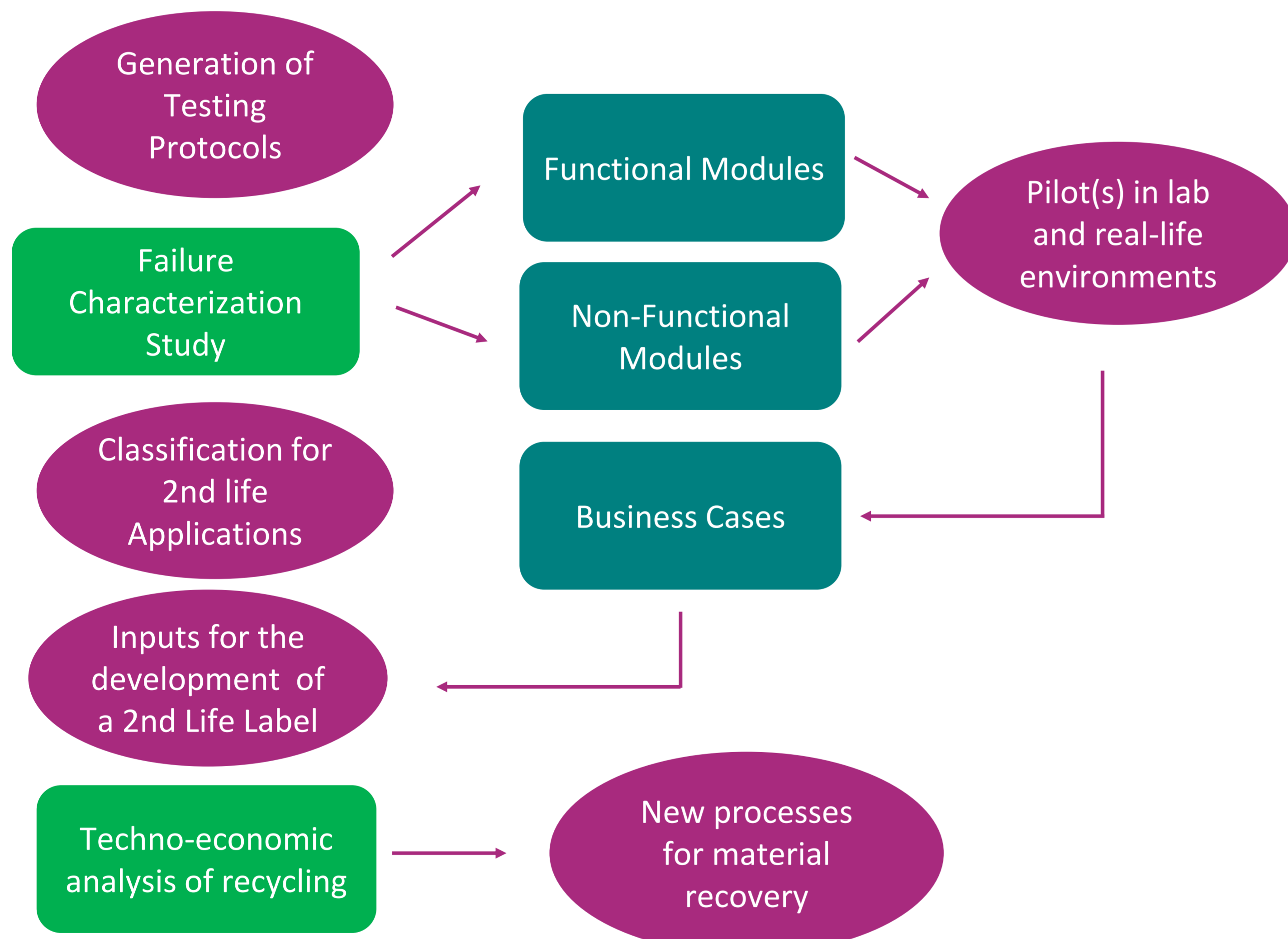

1. CONTEXT

- According to a recent study by RIGK and In-Data for the Ministry of Energy, there will be between 161 million and 270 million PVM in the country by 2050. Considering their useful life, the first major end-of-life waste peak will be in 2046, with 120,000 tonnes.
- Most projects will be in the north of Chile, in a desert and high radiation environment.
- Industrial recycling requires a large number of modules, energy-efficient and sustainable technologies.
- According to the study, the most cost-effective method is to collect reusable modules at the dismantling site, with sorting, visual and electrical testing and documentation performed directly upon removal. Chile lacks the infrastructure to carry out this service.
- PVM testing and classification must be standardised so that they can be safely reused.
- The industry does not have data on the number of decommissioned modules, their condition, failure rates, materials and components.



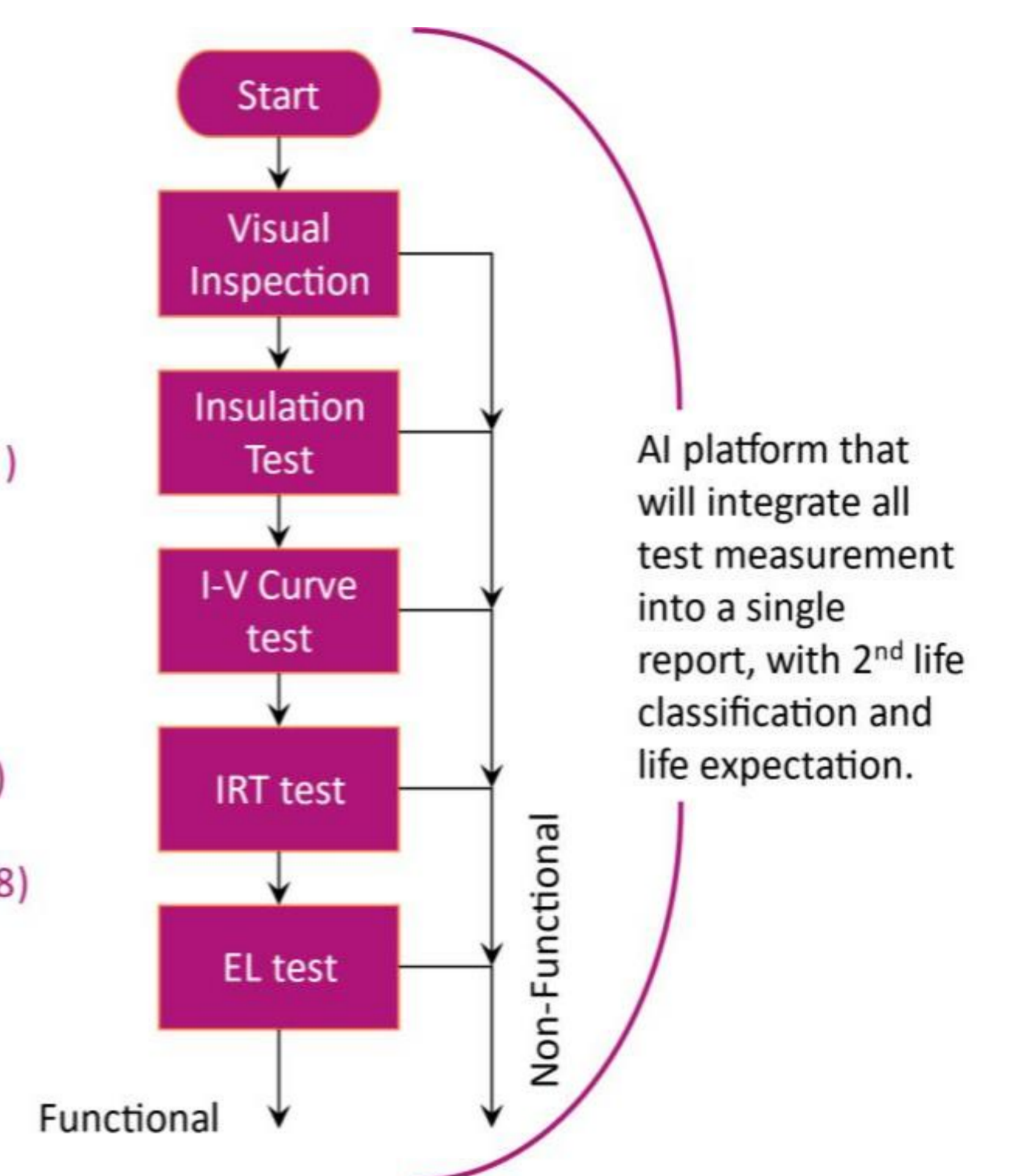
