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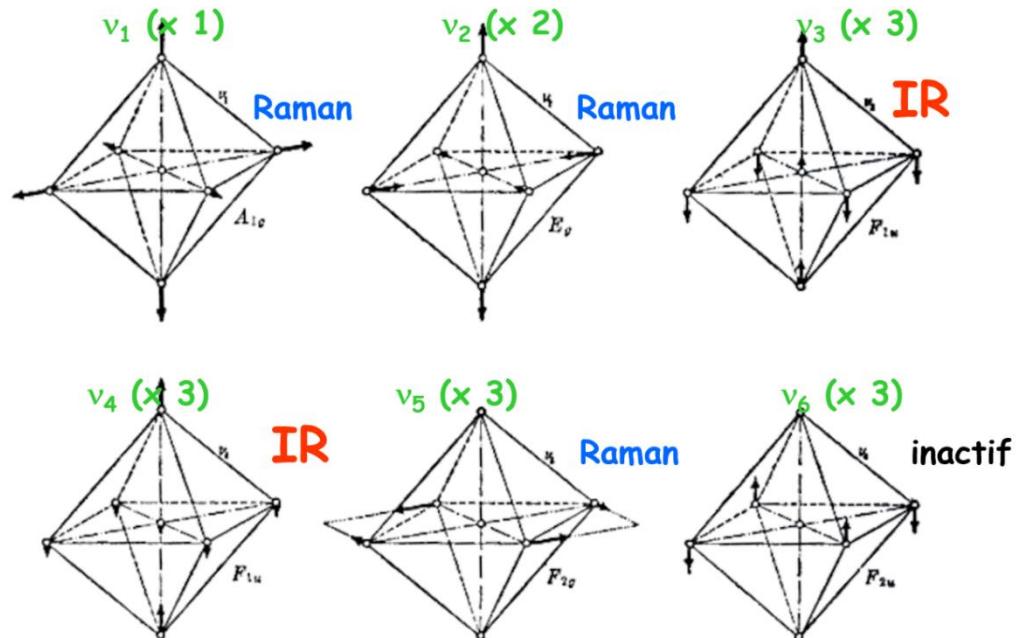

# 1. Optical $\text{UF}_6$ detection

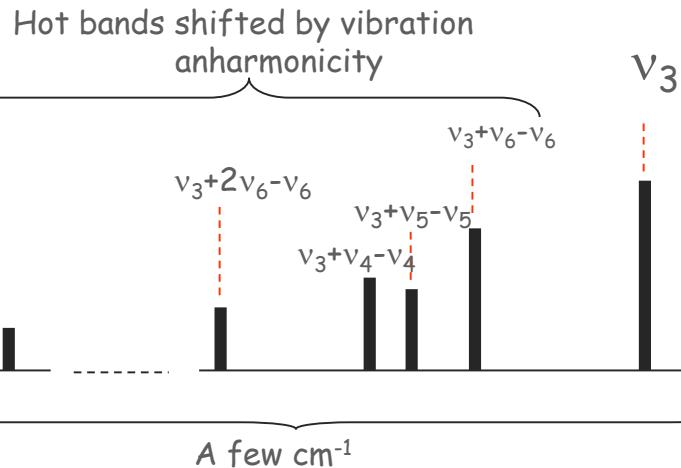


Band	Frequency (cm <sup>-1</sup> )	Isotopic shift (cm <sup>-1</sup> )
$v_1$	667	0
$v_2$	534	0
$v_3$	626	0.65
$v_4$	186	0.16
$v_5$	200	0
$v_6$	143	0

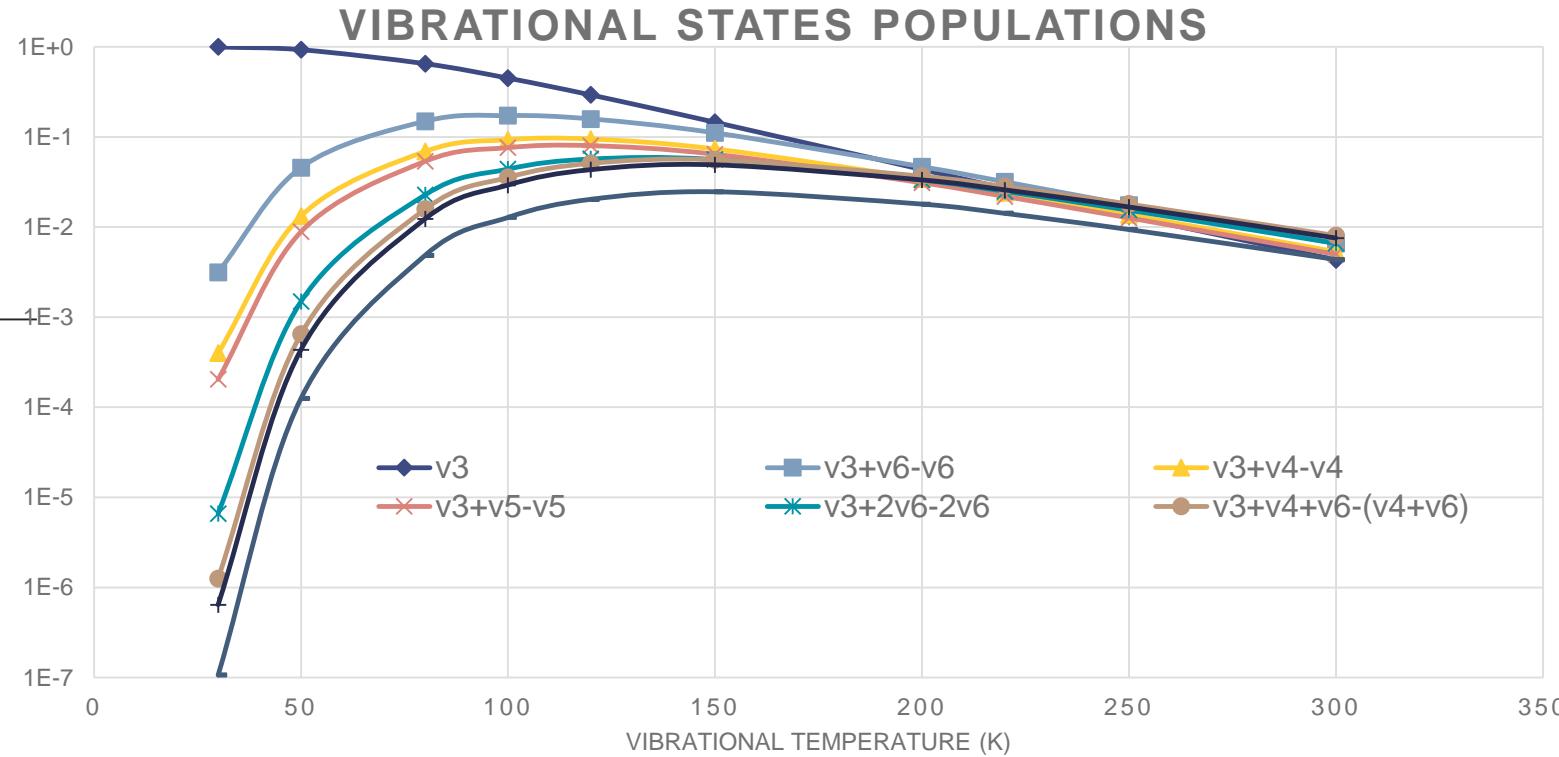
Isotopic shift maximum for  $v_3$  band and maximal cross section coefficient

## Purely vibrational spectra

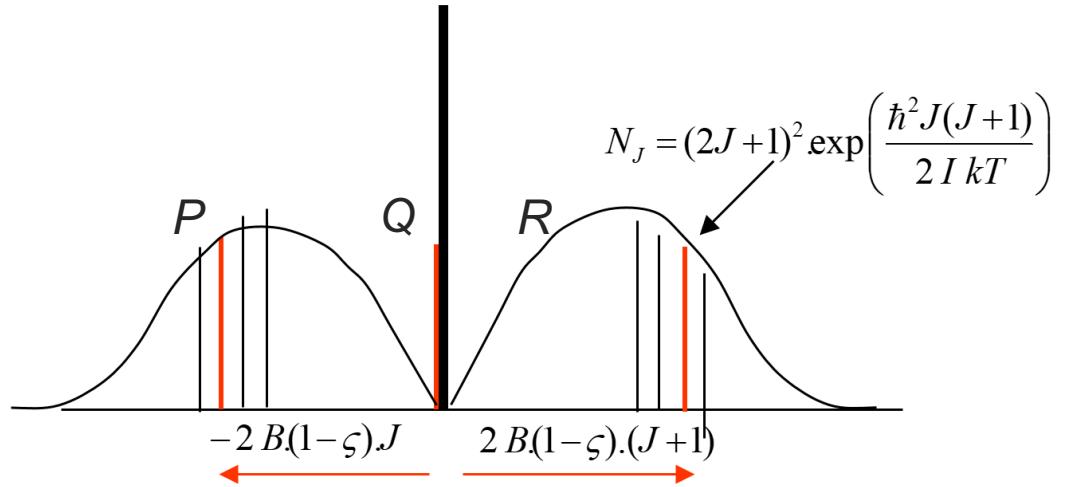


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# 1.1 Rotational spectra

## Purely rotational spectra



PQR branches:  $P : \Delta J = -1$ ,  $Q : \Delta J = 0$ ,  $R : \Delta J = +1$   
 (J: rotational quantum number)

Energy levels spherical rotator ( $I_x = I_y = I_z = I$ )

$$E_J = \frac{\vec{J}^2}{2I} = \frac{\hbar^2 J(J+1)}{2I}; J=0,1,2,\dots$$

Rotational transitions :  $J \rightarrow J + \Delta J$ ;  $\Delta J = 0, \pm 1$

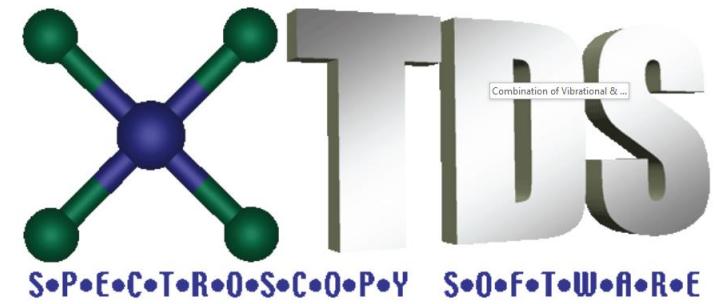
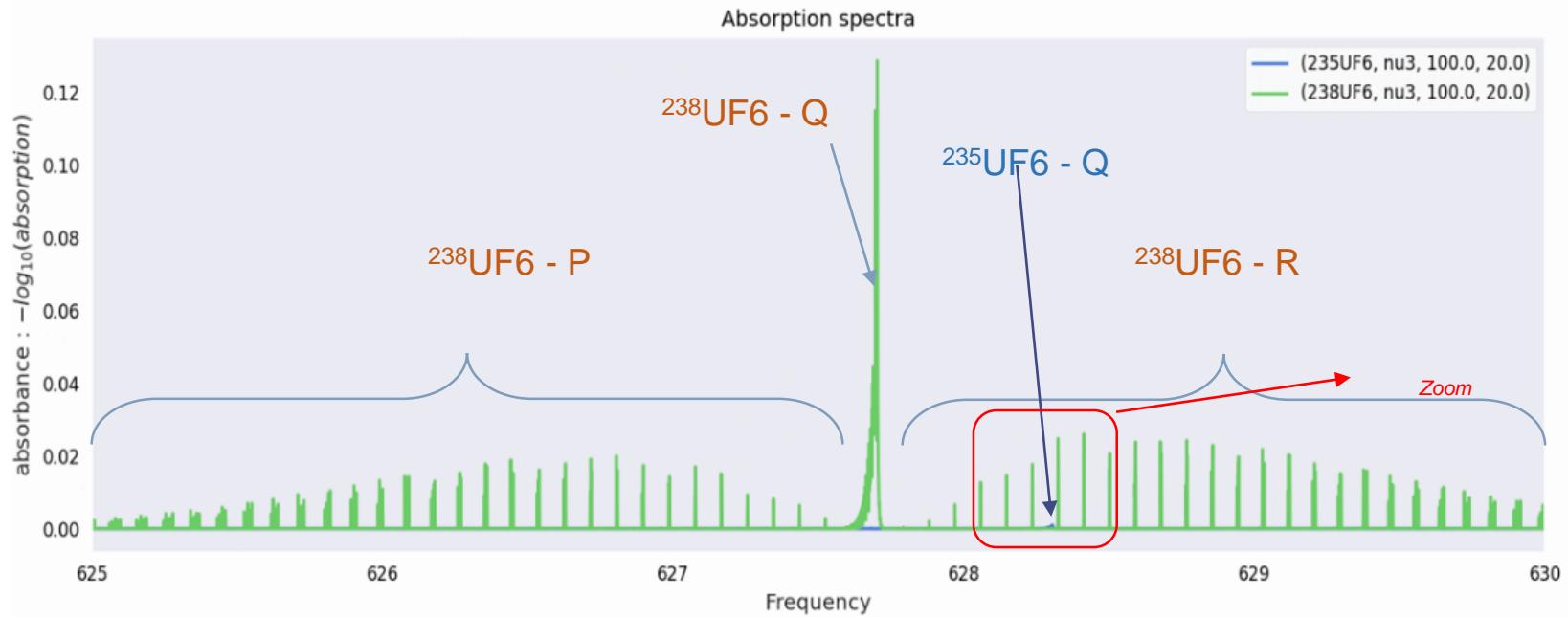
Wavenumber :  $\sigma = \frac{E_{J+\Delta J} - E_J}{hc} = 2B m ; B = \frac{h}{8\pi^2 c I}$

$m = -J$  ;  $\Delta J = -1$  (branche P)

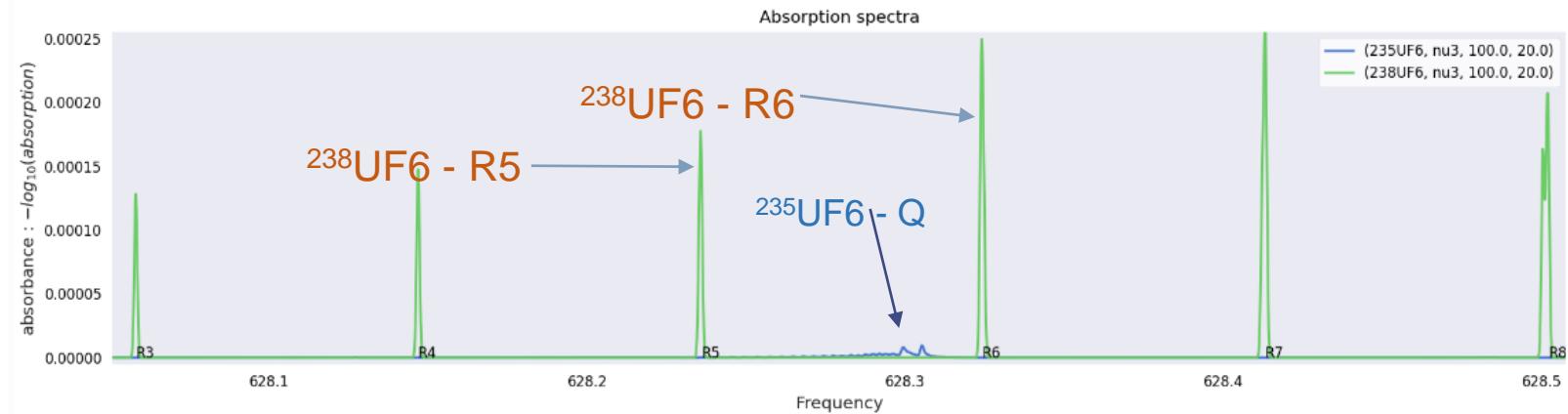
$m = 0$  ;  $\Delta J = 0$  (branche Q)

$m = J+1$  ;  $\Delta J = +1$  (branche R)

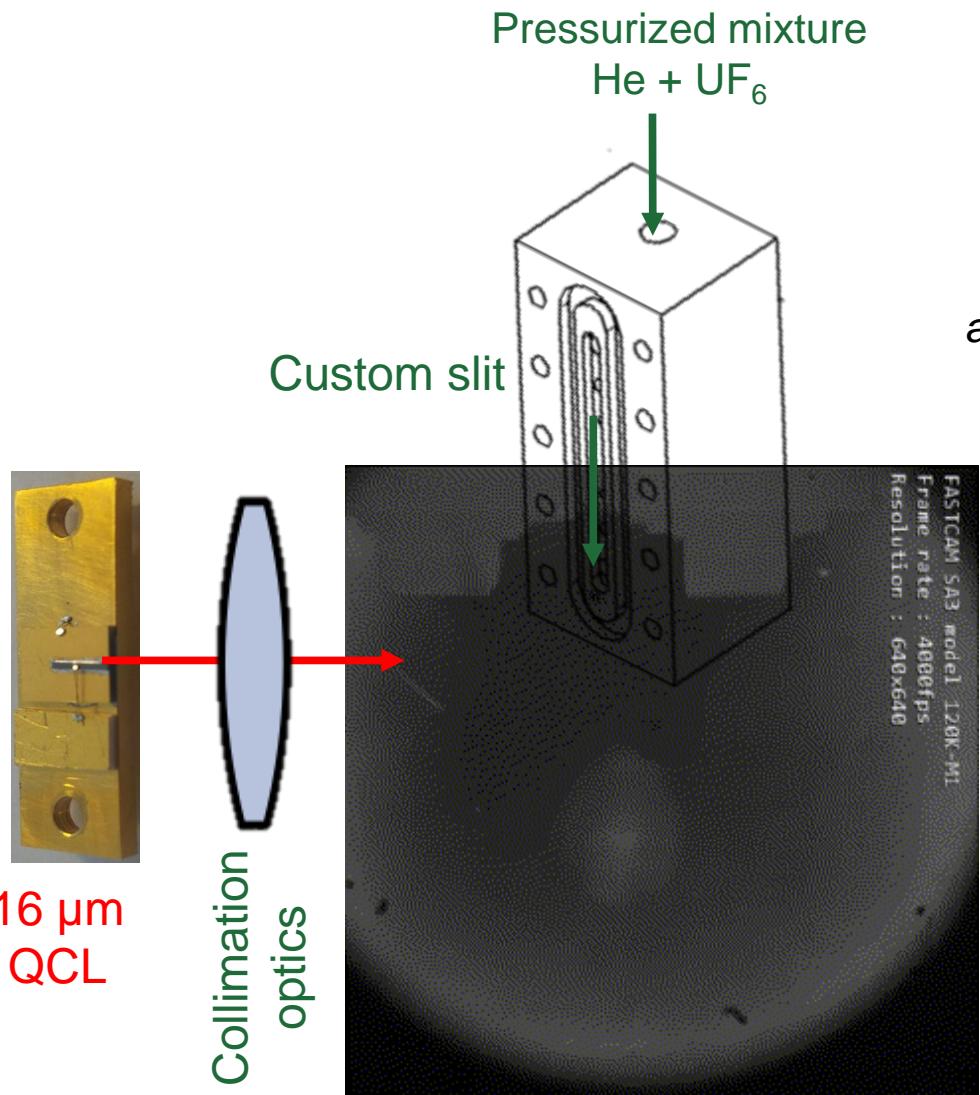
# 1.1 Combination of Vibrational & Rotational spectra



HTDS calculus :  $^{238}\text{UF}_6 + ^{235}\text{UF}_6$



## 1.2 Molecular pulsed jet

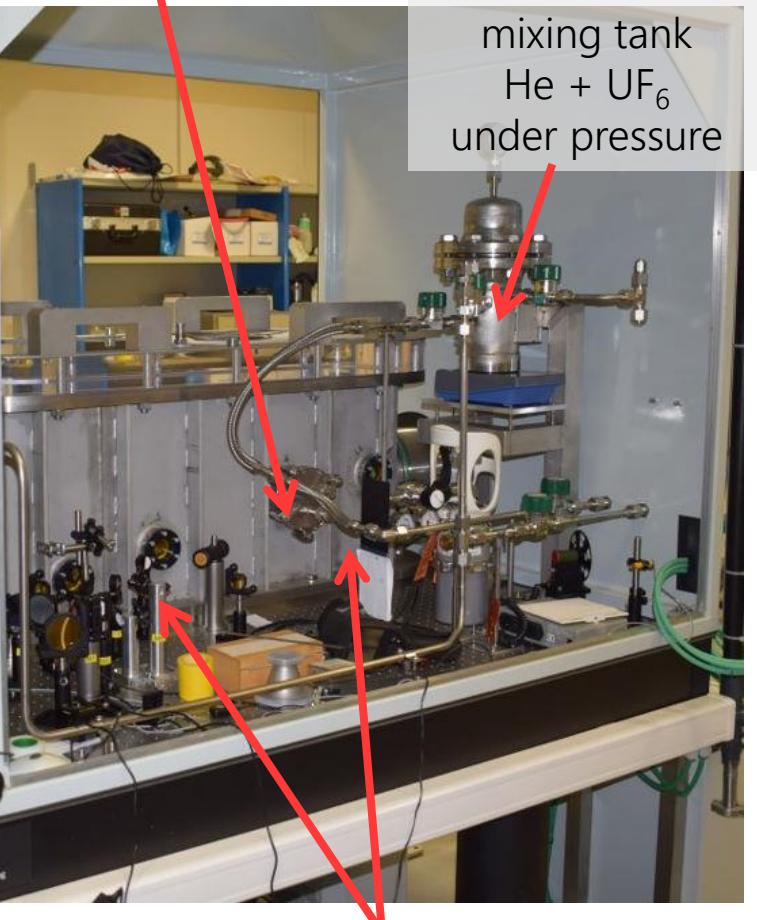


*Pulsed jet symmetry  
analysed in a Michelson  
interferometer*

1. the mixing tank is maintained at a total pressure of a few bars
2. the vacuum chamber is maintained at a high vacuum level
3. pulsed valve on the way
4. the slit is positioned in front of the electro-mechanical needle valve

## 2. Key elements :

Pulsed jet  
gas inlet



Cryostat (~100 K) for the QCL

2 detectors HgCdTe @ 16 μm

QCL laser @ 16 μm [627; 630] cm<sup>-1</sup>; bandwidth < 30 MHz

2 IR detectors HgCdTe + cold filter: [15.490 μm, 16.429 μm]

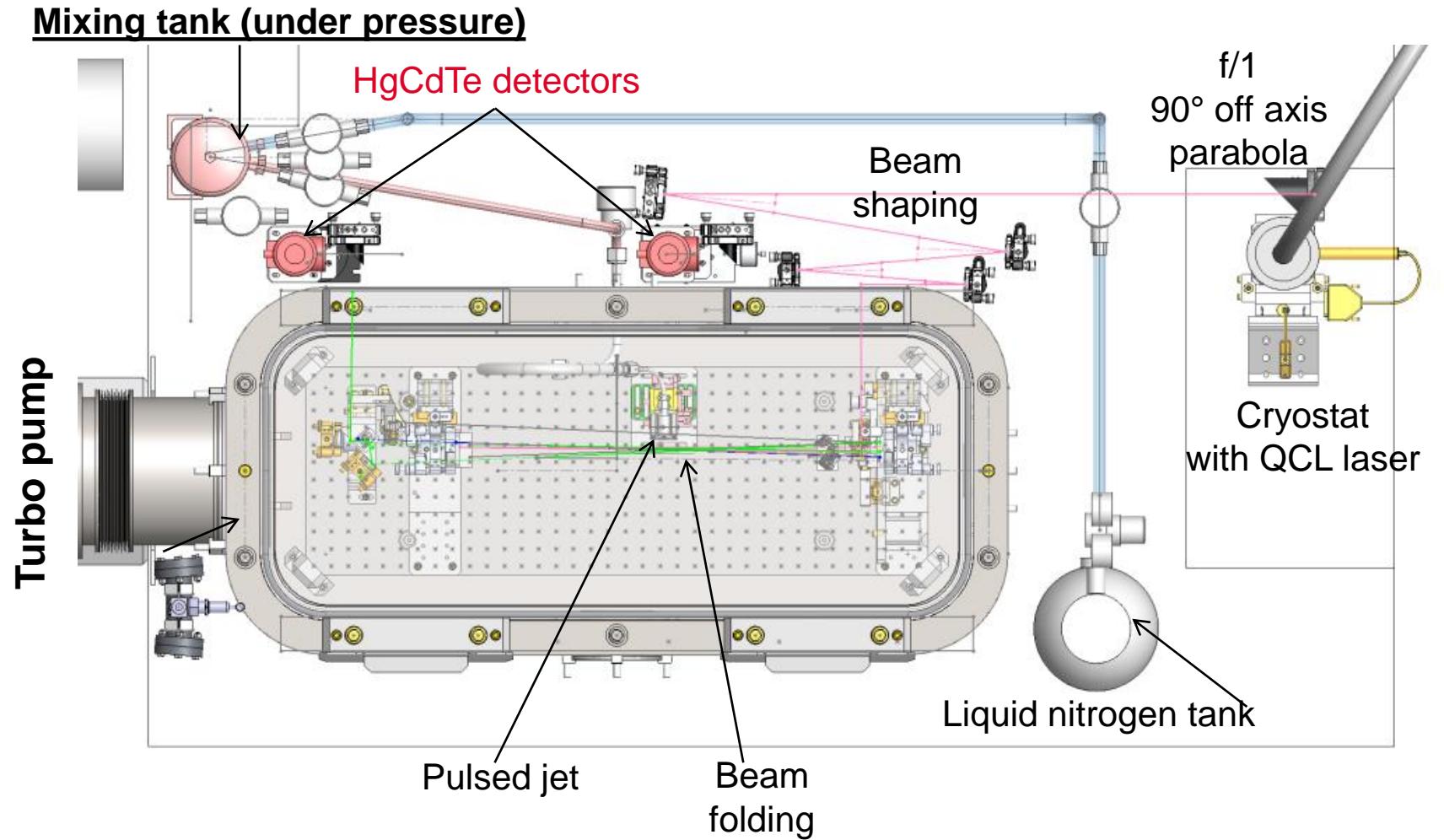
Optical system with spherical mirrors

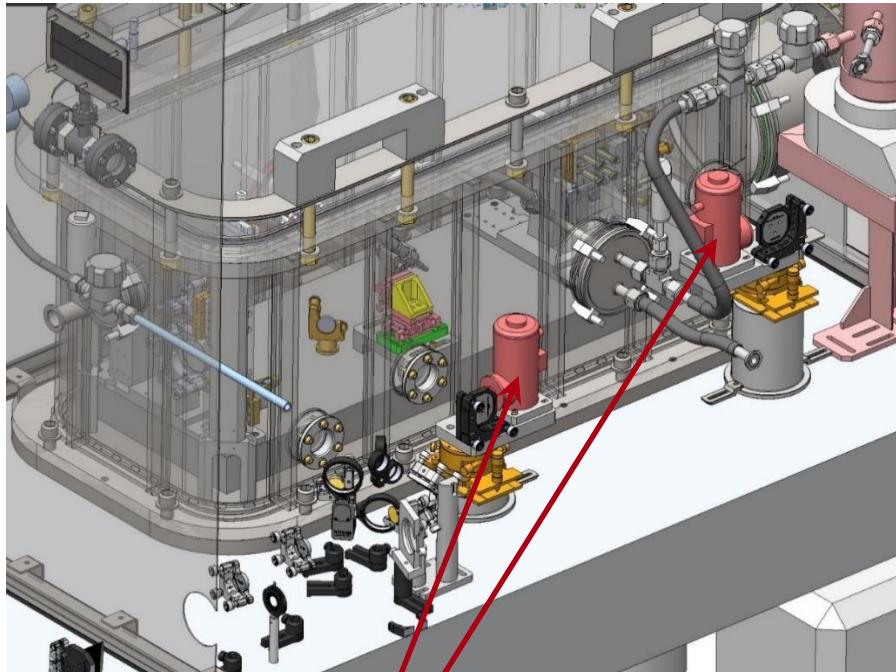
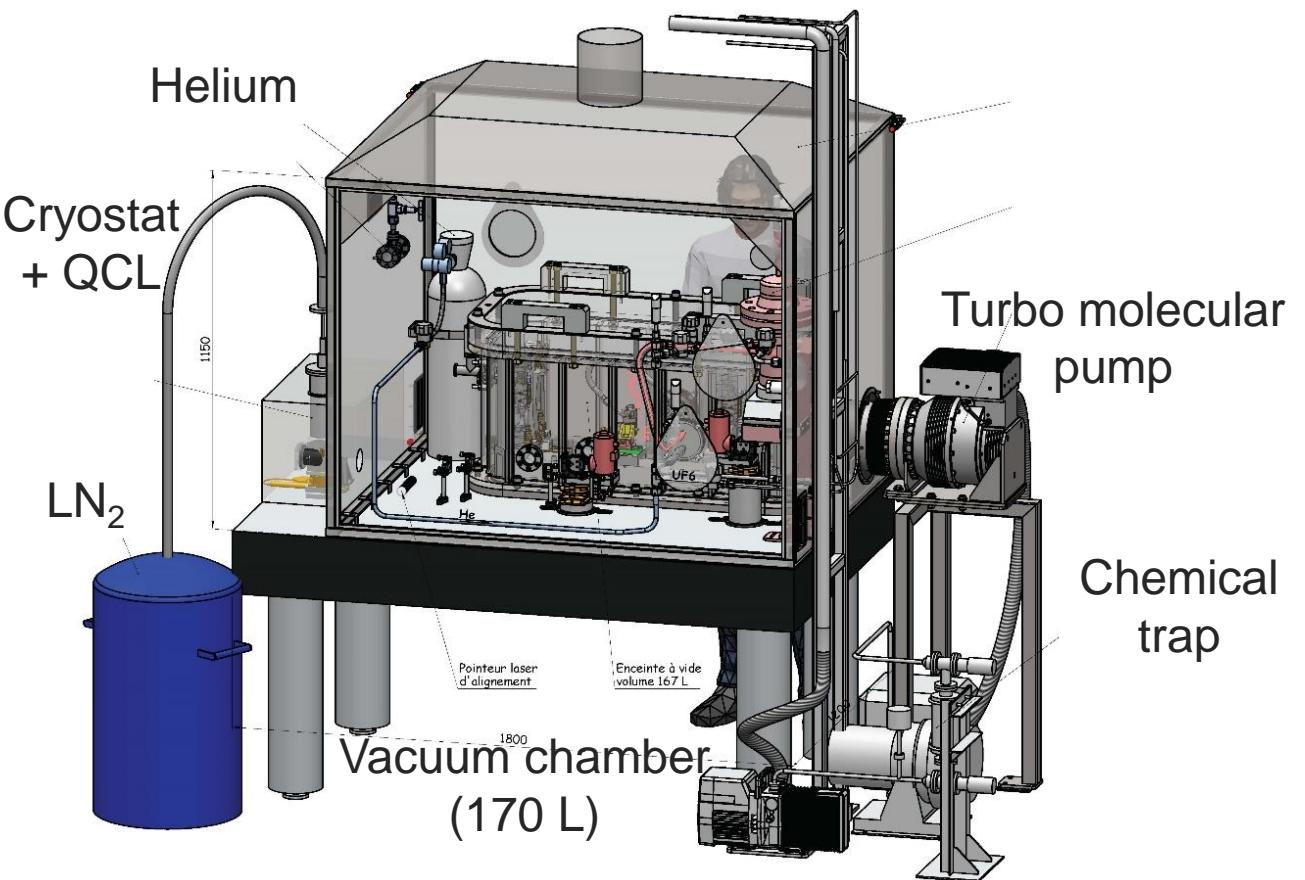

[15.490 µm, 16.429 µm]

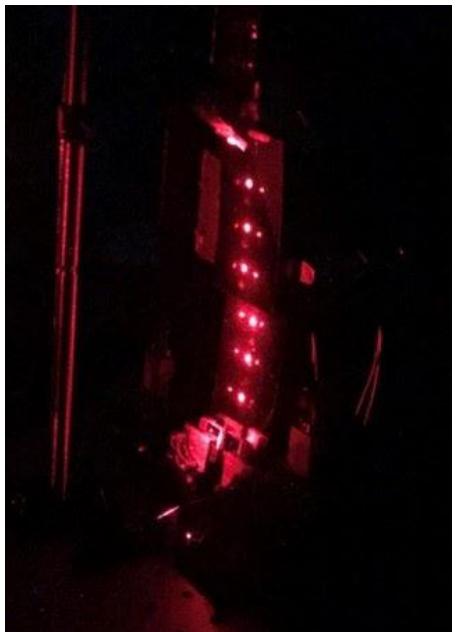


## 2.2 Classical multi-pass cavity

Pre-adjusting the optical cavity with a visible red beam

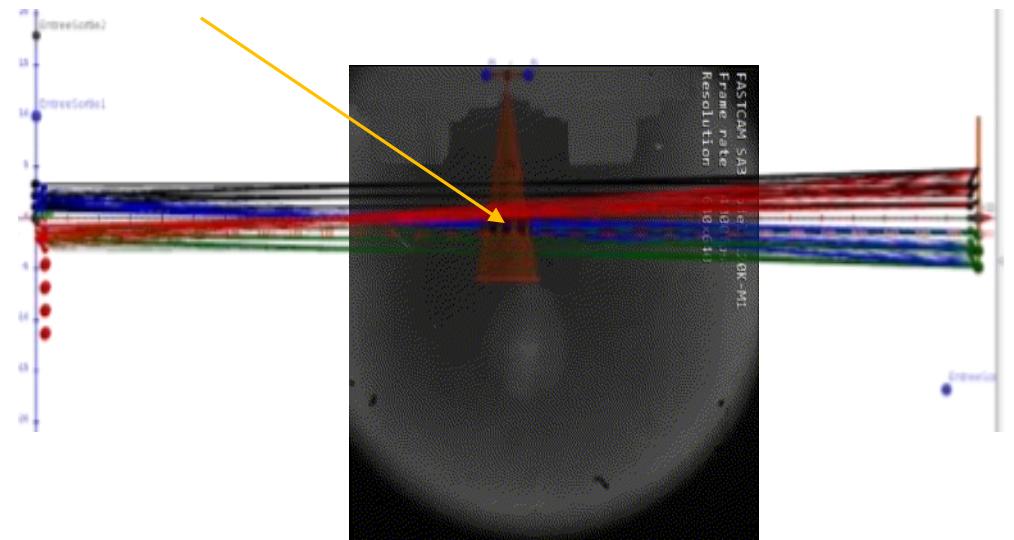


3 sheets :

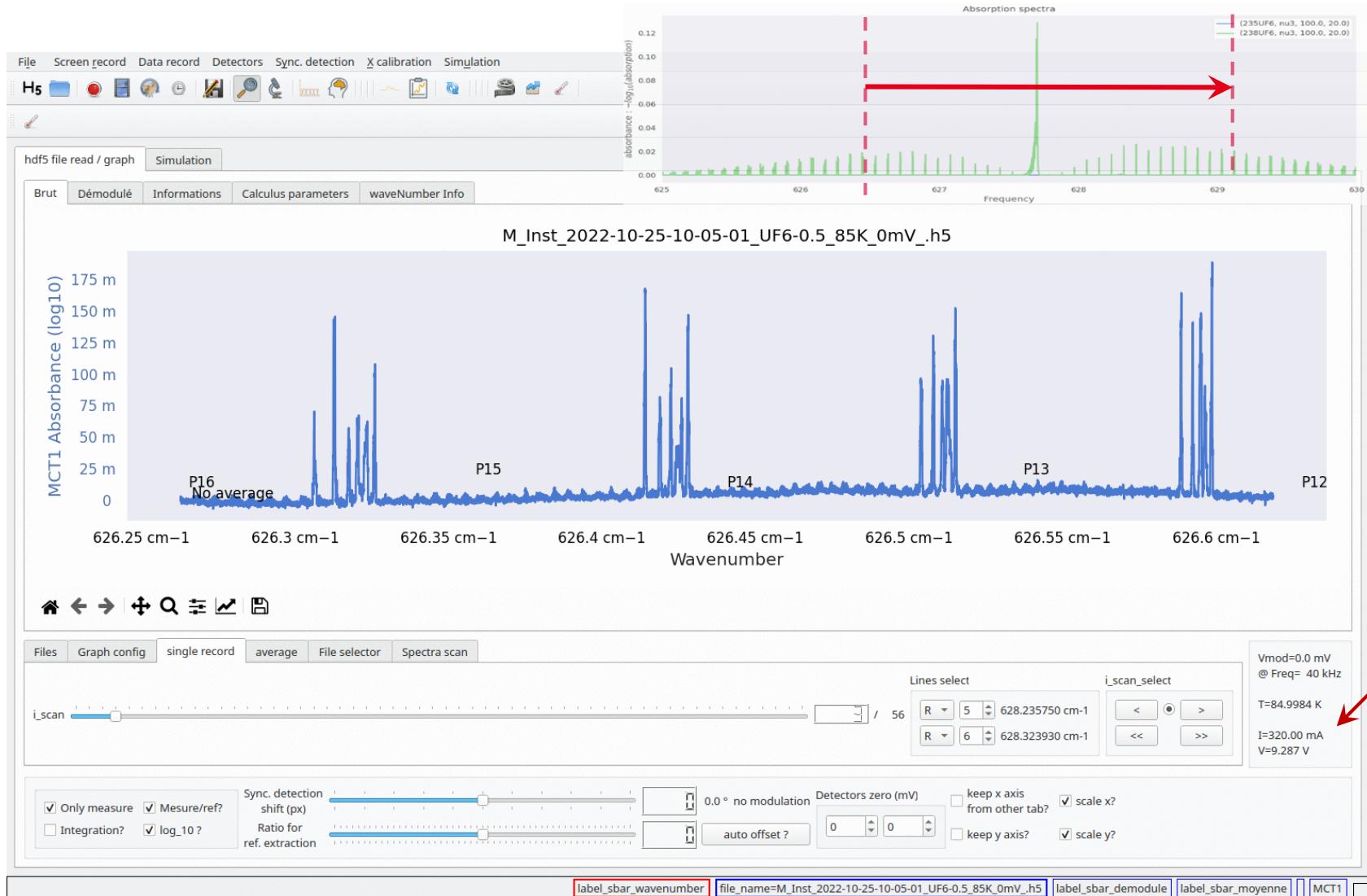


Beams are crossing the jet in a reduced volume

# 3. Measurements

## 3.1 Raw measurement (without modulation) for LEU+, HALEU, HEU

### 3.1.1 : Rotational temperature measurement

Whole R branch and manual fit

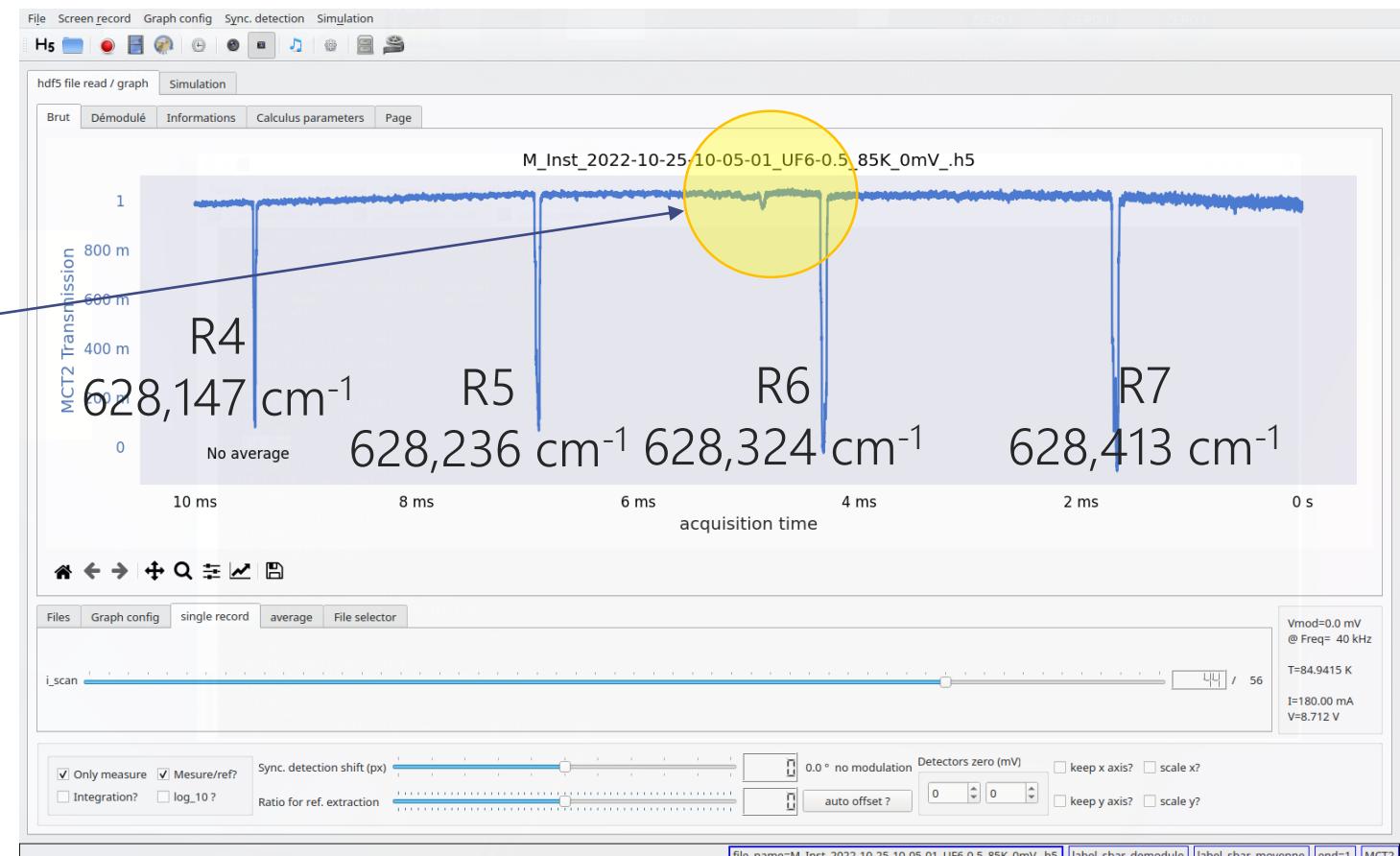
$^{235}\text{UF}_6$  branch Q signal in direct absorption

The choice of the range could be concatenated with others to cover the full spectrum

### 3.1.2 : Isotopic ratio

$$\text{Low precision : Isotopic ratio} = \frac{\text{Mes}_{Q5}}{\text{Mes}_{Q8}}$$

$$\text{High precision : Isotopic ratio} = \frac{\text{Mes}_{\text{Full spectrum 5}}}{\text{Mes}_{\text{Full spectrum 8 + isotop shift}}}$$





# 3. Measurements

3.2 for low assay => Natural up to LEU

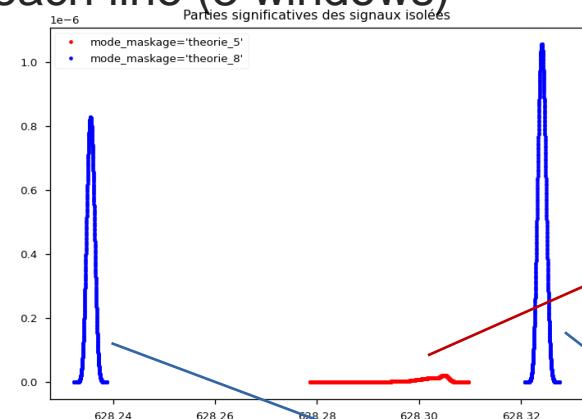
## 3.2.1 : Rotational temperature measurement

Fit automated by SVD analysis on noise simulation

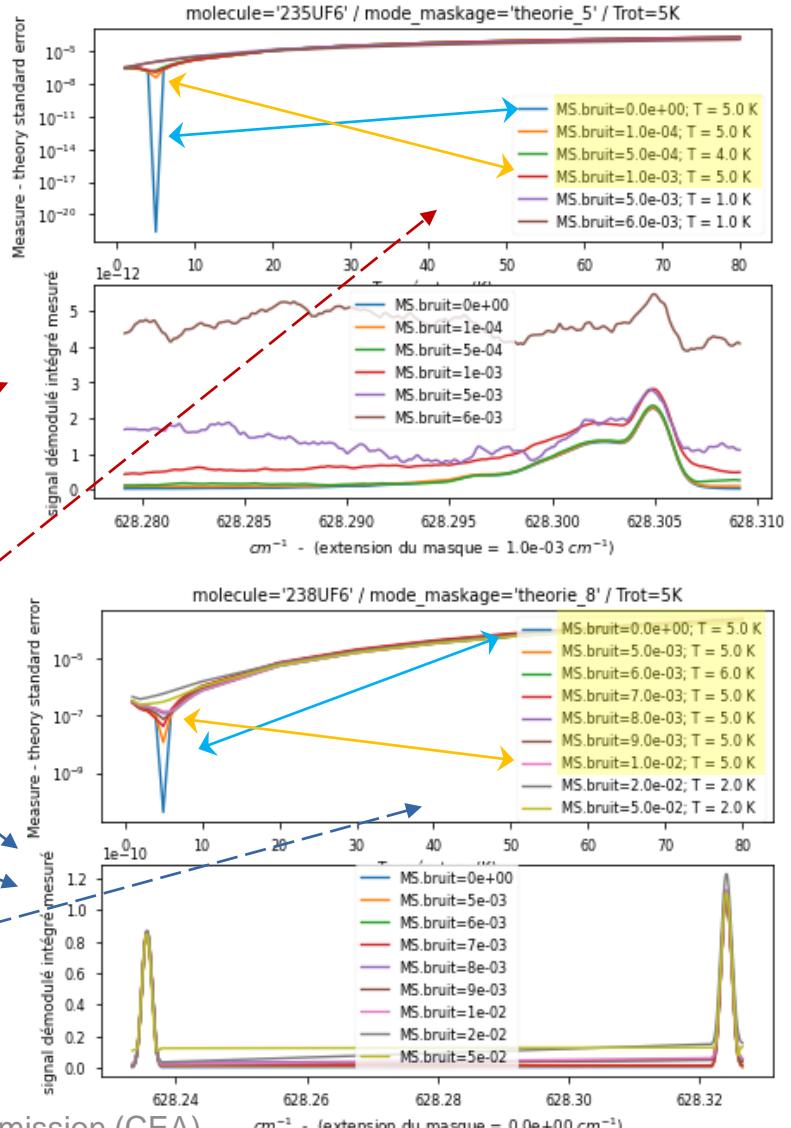
(HTDS model + noise before modulation)

=> First Choice of the window for each line (3 windows)

Use of :  
**235 branch Q**  
 and  
**238 lines R5 R6**



⇒ Numerical maximum noise determination  
 → acceptable to assess temperature





# Measurement signals with demodulation

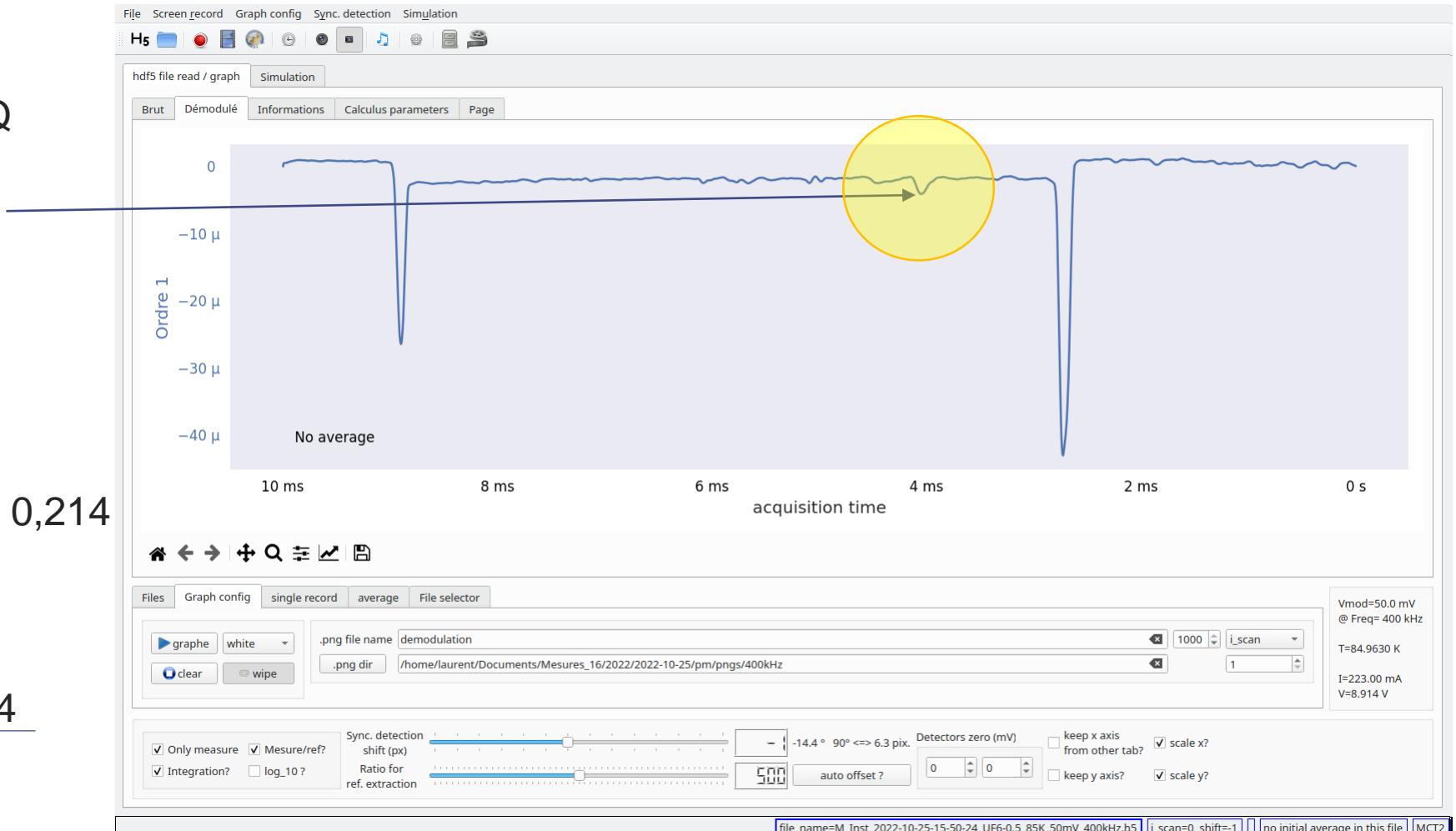
Scan with modulation (example 400kHz / 50mV) on 0,7%  $^{235}\text{UF}_6$ :

Cleaner  $^{235}\text{UF}_6$  branch Q signal as obtained

## 3.2.2 : Isotopic ratio

$$I_{R5+R6} = f(T_{\text{rot}}), \text{ @ } 5 \text{ K} : \frac{I_{R5+R6}}{I_Q} = 0,214$$

$$\text{Isotopic ratio} = \frac{\text{Mes}_Q \times 0,214}{\text{Mes}_{R5+R6}}$$





# Improvements over existing items

- ▶ Online automatic measurement :

- ▶ Small tank filled with  $\text{UF}_6 + \text{He}$  mixture under pressure
- ▶ Process execution
- ▶ Drain tank to chemical trap

- ▶ Technical sovereignty

- ▶ Non cryogenic QCL (MirSense)
- ▶ No international patent

- ▶ High measurement accuracy expected **for mid assay** :

- ▶ full spectrum analysis with HTDS(235) & HTDS(238)



# Conclusion

► Current measurement accuracy **for low assay** :

$$n(^{235}\text{U}) / n(^{238}\text{U} + ^{235}\text{U}) = (0,7 \pm 0,3) \% \\ (=3 \cdot 10^{-3} \text{ absolute})$$

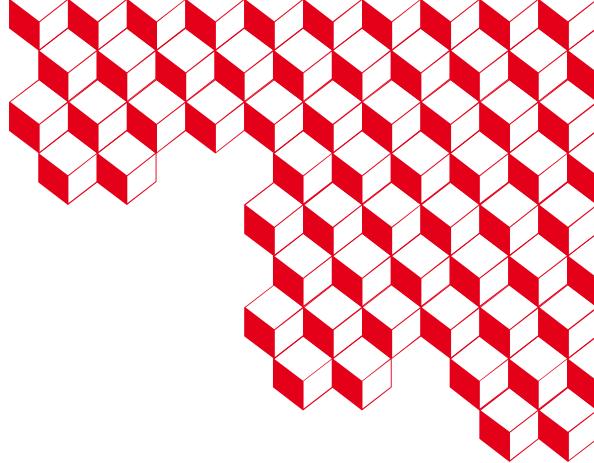
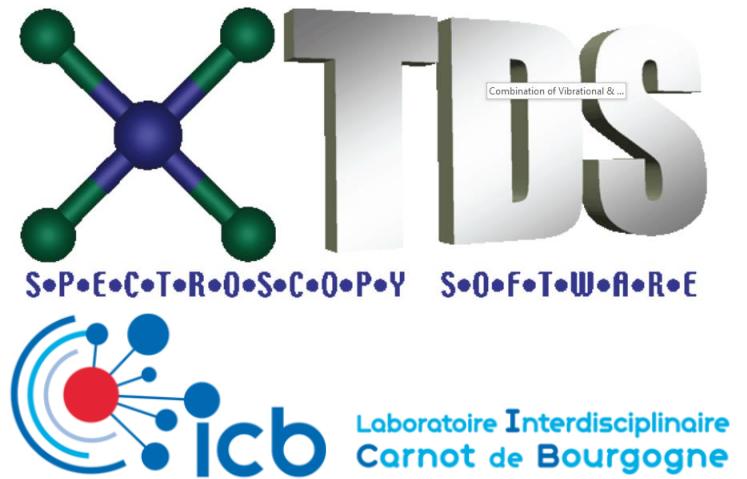
- ▶ Raw measurement without averaging and framing (commercial spectrometers do!)
- ▶ With averaging → expected gain in order of  $< \sqrt{n}$

► Improvements :

- ▶ Carrier gas optimization
- ▶ Measurement averaging & calibration on reference standard
- ▶ No cryogenic QCL (MirSense)
- ▶ Volume reduction

► Measurement accuracy **expected for mid assay** :

- ▶ Much less than  $3 \cdot 10^{-3}$  absolute...
