Naphthalene-derived model lithium salts

□ Hypothesis : Ionic conductivity is more influenced by **anion flexibility** than by **charge delocalization** ^[1]

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Naphthalene-derived model lithium salts

Electrochemical characterizations:

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Polycarbonates are an alternative to PEO for high-energy-density batteries

- Amorphous polymer
- Electrochemical stabilities up 4.8V vs. Li⁺/Li₀
- High transference number $(T_+ = 0.7 0.8)$

Development of an innovative carbonate-based SIPE architecture
