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- Tokamak confinement largely governed by **turbulence**
- ❖ Simulations shows that turbulence organises at mesoscale into **avalanches**, zonal flows & **staircases**

❖ 2 competing instabilities:

**Interchange** (RBM / ITG -like) **B**-field inhomogeneity:  $g = 2\rho_{\star} a/R$ 

## **5. Avalanches reinforce staircases at large g**

 $\partial_t V_{eq} = -\partial_x \Pi_{RS} + v \partial_x^2 V_{eq} - \mu V_{eq}$

- ❖ Correlation measurements using two DBS channels
- ❖ Robust scenario & diagnostic method
- Two correlation lengths obtained close to the Er well

- On-going additions: equilibrium flows, SOL and electromagnetic effects
- **❖ Experiments:** 
	- Varying  $\rho_s$  through gas scan from D to H (isotope effect) & heating scheme  $\Rightarrow$  explore different turbulent regimes
	- Explore experimental signatures of staircases in  $E<sub>r</sub>$  measurements



- **Various turbulence regimes**
- $\checkmark$  Find signatures for experiments in different turb. regimes
- $\checkmark$  Explore link with zonal flows & staircases

- **n** measurement at different  $\rho_s$  and heating conditions
- Explore experimental signatures of staircases
- 2-slope correlation function similar to  $\bigoplus$ simulations only on **amplitude** signal
- **Eddy size:**  $l_c \approx 4 6 \rho_s$ ■Avalanche size:  $L_a \sim 10 - 20 \rho_s$

- ❖ Staircases expected to limit radial extension of avalanches [Dif-Pradalier 2017]
- avalanches reinforce staircases instead (at large g)

❖ High g: Flows structured in staircases

- DBS antenna **Backscattered**  $\omega_{dop} = k_{\perp} v_{\perp}$ cutoff
- ◆ Reference channel at fixed position & hopping channel scanned radially  $\div$  Doppler shift  $\Rightarrow v_1 \approx E_r/B$  $\div$  Cross-spectrum  $\Rightarrow$  correlation & delay

### **Simulations**

- ◆ Reduced model for avalanche, flow & turbulence interaction
- ❖ Transition to avalanche & staircase in interchange dominated plasmas (large magnetic curvature):
	- **Eddy & avalanche size similar to experiments**
- ❖ Staircases appear together with avalanches
- ❖ Staircases strengthened by passing avalanches

### **Correlation Doppler backscattering (CDBS)**

 $\triangleleft$  Dual V-band system in X-mode:  $k_1 \in [4,10]$ cm<sup>-1</sup> ❖ Signal scattered off density fluctuations  $\tilde{n}$  at radial cutoff  $\div$  2 channels  $\Rightarrow$  allows for spatial correlation measurements at  $k_{\perp}$
