- ❖ A strong influence of electricity input price on NPC for e-fuels and e-biofuels

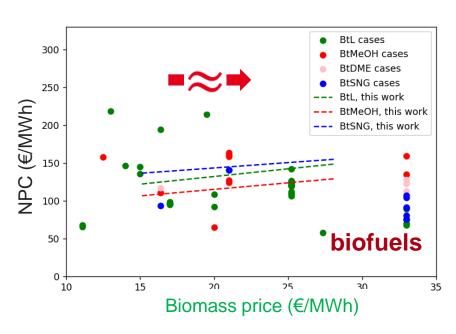

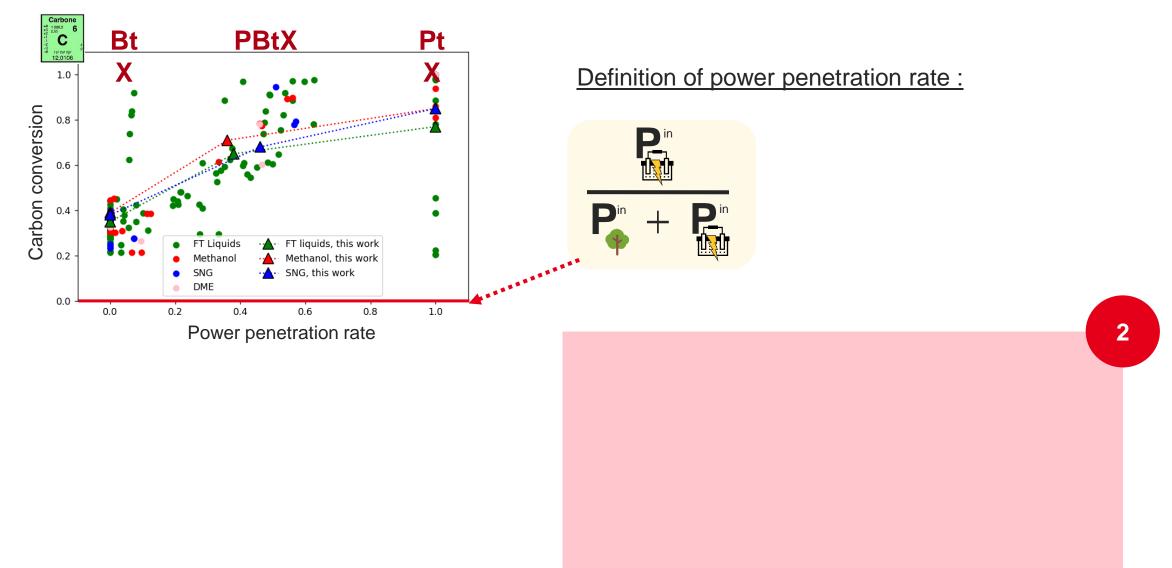


- **♦** Net production cost $\in [50 \rightarrow 250 €/MWh]$
