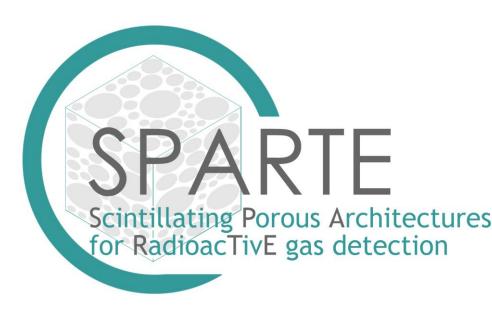

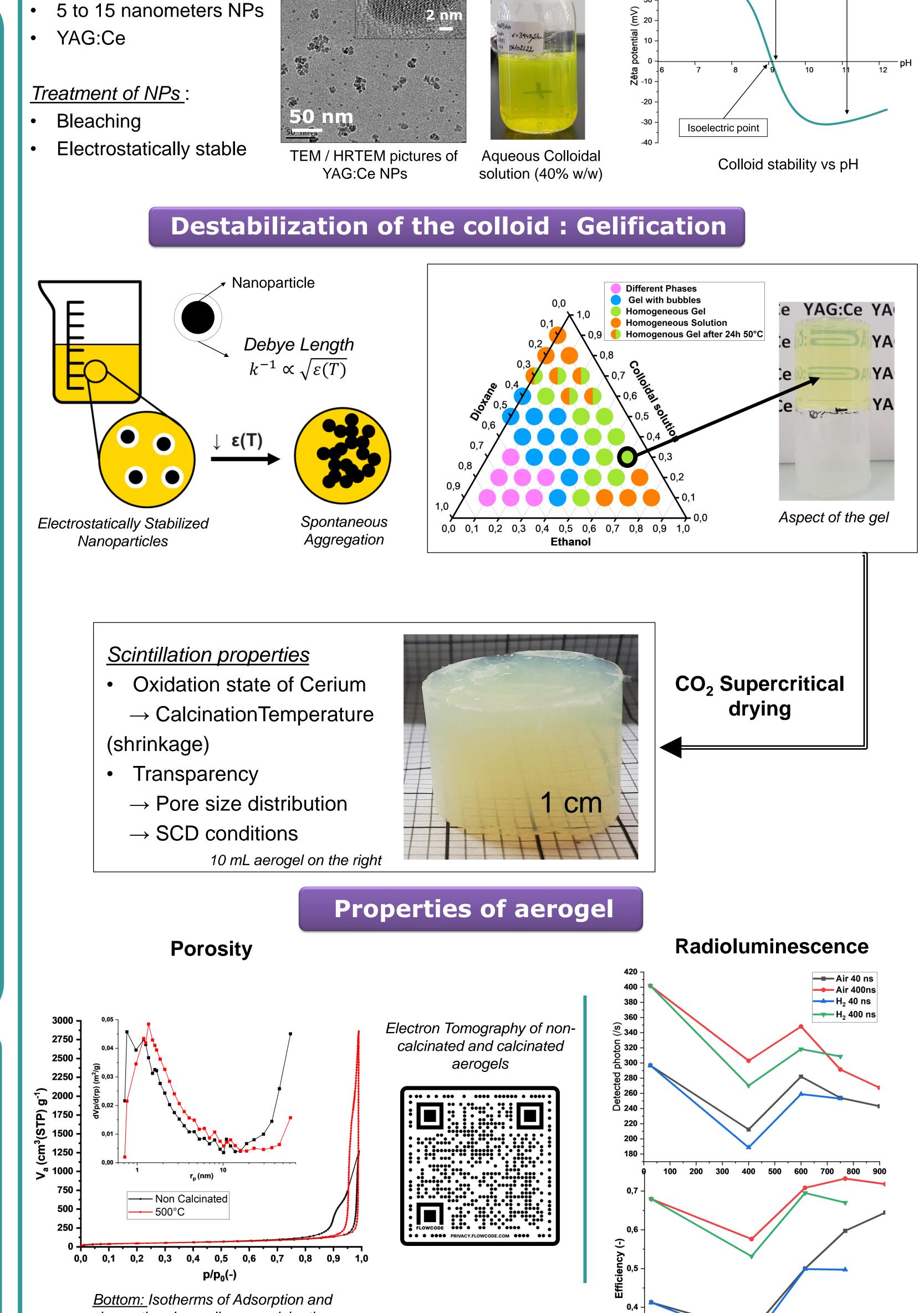

## Introduction

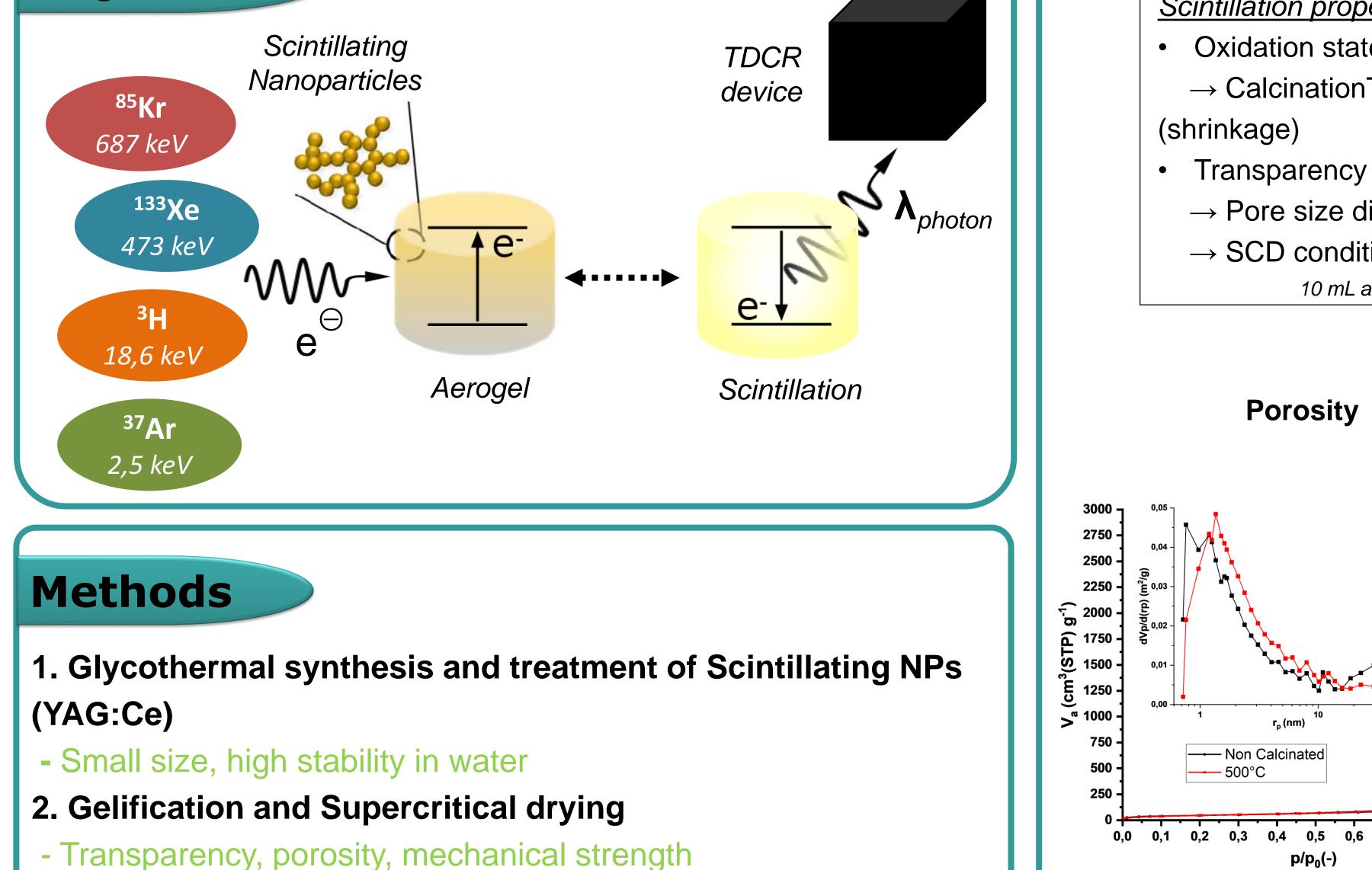
Radioactive gases are key targets for the environment, making gas monitoring an important issue. **SPARTE** will focus on the detection and activity measurement metrology of tracers related to nuclear activities. Measurement of a low energy ionizing radiation is difficult due to a short mean free **pathway** of emitted particles. This means that beta and alpha particles are easily stopped by matter and never reaching a detector. Nowadays, such measurements are performed by scintillators which liquid using posses several **disadvantages:** i) uncertainty of measurement; ii) limited efficiency.

Therefore, we aim to develop alternative approach using porous inorganic scintillators for Radioactive gas detection.

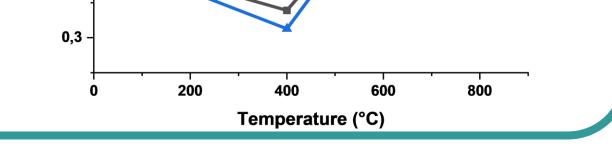
